

An Ordinance to provide for the issuing of the bonds of the City of Alliance Ohio for the purpose of extending the time of payment of certain indebtedness which from its limits of taxation said city is unable to pay at maturity

Sec I Be it ordained and enacted by the council of the City of Alliance Ohio that for the purpose of extending the time of payment of so much of its existing indebtedness as being due March 28th 1895 and April 1st 1895 as from its limits of taxation said city is unable to pay at maturity there be issued the bonds of the City in the sum of six thousand five hundred (\$6500) dollars as hereinafter provided.

Sec II That said bonds be in denominations of thirteen bonds of five hundred dollars (\$500) each and shall be numbered from 1096 to 1108 inclusive and shall bear date of March 28th 1895 and shall become due and payable March 28th 1905. Said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of six per cent per annum payable semiannually on the 28th day of September and March each year and the several installments of interest shall be evidenced by coupons attached to said bonds and both principal and interest shall be payable when due at the office of the City Treasurer of Alliance Ohio. Said bonds shall express on their face the purpose for which they are issued and that they are issued under and in pursuance of this Ordinance and shall be signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the Clerk of said City under the corporate seal of said City

Sec III - That the Mayor and Clerk of said City are hereby authorized and directed as soon as practical to prepare and execute said bonds and the proceeds thereof when the same shall have been disposed of shall be used and applied for the sole purpose of paying off and removing and extending said maturing indebtedness of said City and to no other purpose whatsoever

Sec IV - This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and legal publication. (Passed Feb 18th 1895)

An Ordinance Granting a franchise to The Mutual Light Company to lay gas pipes and erect poles and string wires in the streets and alleys of the City of Alliance Ohio.

Sec I- Be it ordained and enacted by The Council of the City of Alliance Stark County Ohio That authority is hereby given to The Mutual Light Company of Alliance Ohio to lay pipes and conductors for conducting artificial gas through the streets, lands, alleys and squares of said city

Sec II- Be it further ordained and enacted by said Council that authority is hereby given said Mutual Light Company to construct lines for conducting electricity for power and light purposes through the streets, alleys, lanes, lands, squares and public places of said City by the erection of the necessary fixtures including posts, poles, piers and abutments necessary for the wires and construct thereon water-proof insulated wires and attach lamps thereto

Sec III- The franchise and privileges granted in the two preceding sections are granted upon the following terms and conditions Viz: Said Mutual Light Company shall only occupy and use such portions of said Streets alleys lands and public grounds for the purposes aforesaid as may be designated from time to time by said Council. That any and all pavements, sidewalks, crosswalks, curbstones, streets alleys lands or other public lands or property disturbed or displaced or injured by said Company in the prosecution of its work as aforesaid shall be immediately repaired at its own expense and said Company shall leave said streets alleys land and squares and other public property in as good condition or repair as said Company shall find them and on failure so to do said City shall have the right to do the same for said Company and at its expense. That before said Company can avail itself of any of the provisions of this ordinance it shall execute and deliver to said city a bond in the sum of \$5000⁰⁰ payable to said city of Alliance conditioned that said Company shall prosecute its work in a

safe and proper manner, comply with all the terms and conditions of this ordinance and save said city harmless from ~~from~~ any and all liability by reason of any negligence or want of care on the part of said Company, in the construction or operation of any privilege under this ordinance. That said bond shall be signed by said Company and (at least three) sureties to be approved by this Council and said Council may demand other and different bondsmen or sureties at such time as said Council may see fit.

Sec IV— This Franchise may be revoked by this Council whenever in the opinion of said Council the provisions of this ordinance are not complied with, and said Company shall pay for the legal publication of this ordinance.

Sec V— This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after ten days from its first publication.

An Ordinance to levy a special tax of one mill in addition to all other taxes levied for municipal purposes in pursuance of the special authority therein set forth'

Whereas the general assembly of the state of Ohio by an act entitled "an act to authorize the city of Alliance Ohio to borrow money and issue bonds therefor to pay the outstanding indebtedness of said city" passed February 12th 1889 did authorize the Council of said city to issue bonds in any sum not exceeding \$15000⁰⁰ and to levy a tax on all the taxable property in said city not exceeding one mill on each dollar of valuation in any one year for the purpose of paying said bonds and the interest thereon and whereas in pursuance of said authority the Council of said city did on March 18th 1889 authorize the issue of said bonds in the sum of \$14000⁰⁰ in accordance with the provisions of said act of the general assembly. Therefore Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the City of Alliance Ohio that for the purpose of paying said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due a tax is hereby levied on all the taxable property in said city except the sixth ward (formerly Mt Union) of one mill on each and every dollar for the year 1895 in addition to the taxes now authorized by law which levy the Clerk of said city is hereby directed to certify to the Auditor of Stark County to be placed on the tax duplicate and collected as other taxes.

Sec 11 This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage

An Ordinance to provide for the issuing of ^{the} bonds of the City of Alliance, Ohio, for the purpose of extending the time of payment of certain indebtedness, which, from its limits of taxation, said city is unable to pay at maturity.

Sec. 1. Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the city of Alliance, Ohio, that for the purpose of extending the time of payment of so much of its existing indebtedness coming due June 15th and August 1, 1895, as from its limits of taxation said city is unable to pay at maturity, there be issued the bonds of the city in the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) as hereinafter provided.

Sec. 2. That said bonds shall be in denominations of ten bonds of \$500 each, shall bear date of August 1, 1895, and shall become due and payable as follows: \$2,000 August 1, 1895, and \$3000 August 1, 1900. Said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of six percent per annum payable semi-annually on the first day of February and August each year, and the several installments of interest shall be evidenced by coupons attached to said bonds, and both principal and interest shall be payable when due at the office of the City Treasurer of Alliance, Ohio. Said bonds shall express on their face the purpose for which they are issued, and that they are issued under and in pursuance of this ordinance, and shall be signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the Clerk of said city under the corporate seal of said city.

Sec. 3. That the Mayor and Clerk of said city are hereby authorized and directed, as soon as practical to prepare and execute said bonds, and the proceeds thereof, when the same shall have been disposed of, shall be used and applied for the sole purpose of paying off and removing and extending said maturing indebtedness of said city, and for no other purpose whatsoever.

Sec I- Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the City of Cincinnati Ohio that there be Levied and assessed on each front foot of the lots and lands bounding and abutting on Market street from Arch street west to Union Avenue the sums hereinafter named for each and every year as herein specified to wit:

Sec I- Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the City of Alliance Ohio
that the improvement of Ash street from South Liberty Avenue east to the
Cleveland & Pittsburgh Railroad Company's right of way be proceeded with
in accordance with the resolution to improve the same adopted June
24th 1894 by grading the same paving the roadway with shale paving bricks
or block setting curb and gutter stones and constructing the necessary

Sec II- The cost and expense of said improvement
including the damages if any assessed in favor of any owner of adjoining

Whereas on the 20th day of January 1893 one Gertrude F. Campbell obtained a judgment against the City of Alliance Ohio in the sum of \$3800⁰⁰ with interest thereon from the 9th day of January 1893. together with the costs thereon taxed at \$315⁸² and whereas there is not enough money in the City treasury to pay the same and whereas it is deemed by the Council of this City for the best interest thereof to issue bonds for the payment of the same. - Therefore.

Sec 1- Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the City of Alliance Ohio that for the purpose of paying the judgment interest and costs in the said case of Gertrude F. Campbell against the City of Alliance Ohio nine bonds of this city shall be issued in denominations of five hundred dollars each payable in ten years from the date of their issue at the office of the City treasurer and shall bear interest at the rate of five percent per annum payable semiannually - and shall express on their face the purpose for which they are issued and under what Ordinance

Sec 2- Said bonds shall be signed by the Mayor and Clerk of this City and sealed with the seal of said City and shall be sold in the manner provided by law for the sale of Municipal bonds.

Sec 3- The proceeds arising from the sale of bonds shall be applied to the payment of said judgment interest and costs and for no other purpose

Sec 4. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law

An Ordinance declaring it necessary to construct a sewer disposal and to issue bonds to pay therefor.

Sec 1. Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the City of Alliance Ohio that it is necessary to purchase or appropriate ground and construct a sewer disposal to take care of the sewerage now and hereafter flowing from the present sewer system of this city.

Sec 2. That for the purpose of providing money for the purchase or appropriation of ground and construction of the sewer disposal mentioned in the preceding section of this Ordinance Forty bonds aggregating the sum of twenty thousand dollars of this city be issued and sold in denominations and payable as follows: *Viz*: Four bonds of five hundred dollars each payable September 5th 1899. four bonds of five hundred dollars each payable September 5th 1900. four bonds of five hundred dollars each payable September 5th 1901. five bonds of five hundred dollars each payable September 5th 1902. five bonds of five hundred dollars each payable September 5th 1903. five bonds of five hundred dollars each payable September 5th 1904. Six bonds of five hundred dollars each payable September 5th 1905 and six bonds of five hundred dollars each payable September 5th 1906. All of said bonds shall bear five per cent interest per annum payable semiannually. Said bonds shall be payable at the office of the City treasurer at Alliance Ohio.

Sec 3. Said bonds shall be signed by the Mayor and City Clerk and shall be sealed by the seal of this city and shall be sold in the manner provided by law for the sale of municipal bonds.

Sec 4. The proceeds arising from the sale of said bonds shall be placed in the city treasury to the credit of a fund to be

known as the "sewer disposal fund" and shall be used for the purpose of providing ground and constructing said sewer disposal and no other purpose.

Sec 1.- Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the City of Alliance Ohio that to pay the immediate cost and expense of improving Ash Street from south Liberty Avenue East to the C & P R.R. and in anticipation of the collection of a special assessment therefor. The Mayor and Clerk be and they are hereby authorized to issue the bonds of this City in the sum of \$2650⁰⁰ as hereinafter provided. Said bonds shall consist of five bonds of \$530⁰⁰ each and shall bear date of Sept 20th 1895 and shall become due and payable as follows: \$530 in one year. \$530 in two years. \$530 in three years \$530 in four years and \$530 in five years from date of issue. Said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of six per cent per annum payable semiannually. and the several installments of interest shall be evidenced by coupons attached thereto and both principal and interest shall be payable when due at the office of the City Treasurer of Alliance Ohio. Said bonds shall be designated "Ash Street Improvement bonds" and shall express on their face the purpose for which they are issued and that they are issued under and in pursuance of this ordinance and shall be signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the Clerk of said City under the corporate seal of said City.

Sec 11- That upon the sale of said bonds the proceeds thereof shall be placed in the Treasury to the credit of the "Ash Street Improvement" fund and shall be applied to the payment of the cost and expense of improving said Ash Street and to no other purpose. and the said special assessments in anticipation of which said bonds are issued shall be paid into the sinking fund when collected and be applied to the payment of said bonds and the interest thereon and to no other purpose whatsoever. Provided that if on or before the sale of said bonds any of the property owners shall pay the full amount of their assessments

That the owners of the several lots of land upon each front foot of which the sums aforesaid are assessed shall pay the amount of money by them severally due in that behalf to the city clerk on or before the first day of September in each of the said several years and in default of such payment the said city clerk shall forthwith certify all unpaid assessments to the County Auditor to be by him placed on the tax duplicate and collected according to law.

An Ordinance to appropriate Real Estate for the Construction of a Sewer Disposal Works.

Sec 1 Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the City of Alliance Ohio that it is deemed necessary and its intention is hereby declared to and it does hereby appropriate to public use for the purpose of constructing thereon a sewer disposal works in accordance with an Ordinance of this City passed August 26th 1895 the following described property situated in the City of Alliance Stark County Ohio; beginning at a point on the north line of Keystone Street 1125.3 feet west of the east line of the north west quarter of section 25 being the south east corner of Out-Lot no 125 in said City; thence north 150.72 feet thence east 105.6 feet thence north 216.9 feet thence west 110.22 feet thence north 30° west 30.76 feet thence south to the north line of Keystone Street. thence east 20 feet to the place of beginning

Sec 2. That the city solicitor is hereby authorized and directed to apply to a court of competent jurisdiction in this County for impaneling a jury to make inquiry into and assess the ~~cost~~ compensation to be paid for such property.

Sec 3. That the cost and expense of said appropriation be paid out of the Sewer disposal fund
