City Solicitor Morris stated that he had recently conferred with Engineer Ballard regarding the light ordinance controversy and stated that Mr. Ballard's engineers had been working on the valuation of the Alliance Gas & Power Company Plant and that the Public Utilities Commission men had been on a vacation and are now starting on that work which will require several weeks time. The city's valuations will be completed at an early date. Owing to the Utilities delay it will likely be necessary to postpone the hearing, which was to start in about ten days.

The City Engineer reported to Council that with Engineer Johnson and Service Director McConnell, he had worked on the map showing the location of the Two Hundred additional street lights to be installed in Alliance. One-half of this number of lights is to be placed on East Main Street in establishing a white way. The lights are to be similar to be those used on Euclid Avenue, Cleveland.
