Alliance, Ohio, Sept. 25, 1916.

To the Council of the City of Alliance.

Communication received from Aldora Shem.

Gentlemen: I, the undersigned, owner of Lots Forty-four Hundred Seventy-one (#4471) and Forty-four Hundred Eighty (#4480) on East Auld Street between Webb and Morgan Avenues, Alliance, wish to inform you that I intend to commence at once, the erection of buildings on said Lots; that a sewer or culvert constructed by the city, which crosses Auld Street, carries considerable water on to said Lots, and more water than would naturally flow thereon; that I consider this a damage to me and that I believe it to be the duty of the City to remedy this at once.

I, therefore, petition your honorable body to take such action as is necessary to carry away this water and to protect the buildings to be erected from damage.

Petition from property owners on W. Harrison Street.

We, the undersigned, owners of the number of feet of property set opposite our names below, the same being a majority of the foot frontage on West Harrison Street, between the paved intersection of said West Harrison Street and Lincoln Avenue west to the east line of Rockhill Avenue, hereby respectfully petition your honorable body to pass the necessary legislation therefore and to improve said street between said points by establishing a grade and to put said portion of said street to said grade, and that so much of the entire costs and expense thereof as may be lawfully assessed upon the adjacent, contiguous or other specially benefited lots and lands, be assessed by the foot front, upon the lots and lands, bounding and abutting on said West Harrison Street between the point aforesaid,
