Objection of S.D. Lane to assessment on Patterson Street.

Hon. Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio.

Objection of Rosa Zeigler to assessment on Patterson and Fifth St.

Mr. Merts: An ordinance to make supplementary appropriations for the current expenses and other expenditures of the City of Alliance, Ohio, for the fiscal half year ending December 31st, 1916; was read the first time.

- Ordinance No. 2249.
- Ord.2249,
1st time. Mr. Penick: An ordinance authorizing the Director of Public Safety to enter into a contract for the purchase of an automobile with full equipment and extra tires, for use of the Chief of the Fire Department.
Referred to the Fire and Patrol Committee.

- Entrance to property on S. Freedom. Binkley called attention to an alley at Max Smith's property on South Freedom Avenue. He stated that entrance was not attainable owing to existing conditions. He also called attention to sidewalk that needed repairing at corner of State Street and Linden Avenue.
Referred to the Director of Public Service.
- Sidewalk State & Linden. -----
- Matter of C.A. & M.V. Street Cars. Lower called attention to the C.A. & M.V. cars running along east Main Street and stopping at Arch Avenue and congesting traffic there. It was stated that a request had been made for a switch on North Arch Avenue, which was deemed not advisable. On motion of Lower, seconded by Grubb, the City Solicitor was instructed to investigate as to whether the company had the right to refuse to carry passengers going north. Also to investigate the question of cars stopping at Arch Avenue, which motion was agreed to.
- Sidewalk on Arch at Morgan Switch. -----
- Sewer in north part of city. Merts called attention to the sidewalk on Arch Avenue at the Morgan Switch. -----
- Grading of alley at Hospital. Penick made inquiry as to a sewer in the north part of the City. It was stated that Council would take the matter up when other bonds were issued, as it would be too expensive to have bonds issued for just this one sewer. -----
- Light at Arch St. Subway. Binkley made inquiry regarding the grading of the alley at the City Hospital. The City Auditor informed him that the bonds had been sold for this purpose. -----
- Park Comm. & Board of Education in session. Merts stated that a light was needed at Arch Avenue Subway. The Service Director stated that the subject had been referred to the Penna. R.R. Company, whose duty it was to supply such light. -----
- Meeting Thursday evening. Mr. L. E. Miller, member of the Park Commission, stated that the Park Commission was in session with the Board of Education relative to some proposition to be presented to Council. -----
- Binkley moved, seconded by Lower, that when we adjourn we adjourn to meet next Thursday evening; which motion was agreed to. -----
- On motion of Lower, seconded by Binkley, Council adjourned.
