We, the undersigned, being all the property owners over which the hereinafter mentioned culvert passed, or abutting thereto, respectfully petition your Honorable Body to construct and build a culvert in conformity with the culvert that is already over said run, being four (4) feet wide, from the northeast end of the present culvert, located south of State St., and east of Freedom Ave., in the City of Alliance, Ohio, and extending to a point in the south line of State St., just west of Liberty Ave., in the City of Alliance, Ohio, and extending to a point in the south line of State St., just west of Liberty Ave. in the city of Alliance, Ohio, excepting therefrom that portion of said culvert which is already constructed, which is across Seneca Avenue.

In consideration of your constructing said culvert, we each and every one of us, bind ourselves to pay to the City of Alliance, Ohio, fifty (50) per cent of the entire cost of said culvert, so constructed, each of us agreeing to pay for the proportionate share of said 50% of the cost of said culvert, pro rata according to the number of feet of said culvert that passes over our land, and that we will pay in cash our proportionate share into the City Treasury as soon as the contract is awarded for the construction of said culvert.
