

A Resolution to improve certain Alleys by sewerage the same.

Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Alliance Ohio, that it is hereby declared necessary to make certain improvements by excavating and laying sewer pipe according to the plans, specifications and profiles relating to the same now on file in the City Engineers office, along the following streets and Alleys, commencing at the manhole at the intersection of Arch street and the first alley parallel with and north of Broadway; thence east along said Alley to Freedom street, also commencing at a manhole at the intersection of the alley south of Columbia street and the Alley east of Seneca street to the north line of Broadway.

The cost and expense of said improvements shall be assessed per front foot upon the lots and lands abutting on said improvement, according to the laws and ordinances on the subject of assessments, and shall be payable in three annual installments, and bonds shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of such assessments. The Clerk is hereby directed to cause this resolution to be published for two weeks in a newspaper published and of general circulation in the Corporation.

An Ordinance to levy taxes for municipal purposes.

Sec 1- Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the City of Alliance Ohio, that there be levied for incorporated purposes for the year 1897, on each and every dollar of valuation of taxable property real and personal in said Corporation the sum of nine (9.) mills and that said levy be apportioned as follows.

For the Sinking fund	2.5 ..
For the Street fund	.7 ..
For the Police & Salary fund	.5 ..
For the Light fund	1.2 ..
For the Water fund	2. ..
For the Fire fund	.9 ..
For the Sewer fund	.3 ..

For the Sanitary fund	.1 ..

Sec 11- That the City Clerk is hereby directed to certify the above levy to the Auditor of Stark County Ohio to be placed on the tax duplicate for collection as provided by law.

An Ordinance to levy a special tax of one mill in addition to all other taxes levied for municipal purposes in pursuance of the special authority therein set forth.

Whereas the general assembly of the State of Ohio by an act entitled an act to authorize the City of Alliance Ohio to borrow money and issue bonds therefore to pay the outstanding indebtedness of said City passed February 12-1889, did authorize the Council of said City to issue bonds in any sum not exceeding \$15000⁰⁰ and to levy a tax on all the taxable property in said City - not exceeding one mill on each and every dollar of valuation in any one year for the purpose of paying said bonds and the interest thereon, and whereas in pursuance of said authority the Council of said City did on March 18-1889, authorize the issue of said bonds in the sum of \$14000⁰⁰, in accordance with the provisions of said act of the general assembly.

Therefore be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the City of Alliance Ohio that for the purpose of paying said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due, a tax is hereby levied on all the taxable property in said City, except the sixth ward (formerly Mt Union) of one mill on each and every dollar for the year 1897 in addition to the taxes now authorized by law, which levy the Clerk of said City is hereby directed to certify to the Auditor of Stark County to be placed on the tax duplicate and collected as other taxes.

Sec 11.- This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Refunding Resolution.

All of said bonds shall bear six per cent interest payable semi-annually from date, and principal & interest shall be made payable at the City Treasurers office in the City of Alliance, Ohio.

An Ordinance to issue Bonds.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the City of Alliance, Stark Co, Ohio.
 Sec 1. That for the purpose of extending the time of the payment of West Main street bond no 924, Linden Avenue improvement bond, nos 886, 887 and 888, Patterson street improvement bond no 818, South Liberty Avenue improvement bond no 926, South Webb Avenue improvement bond no 69, Alley Paving bond No 65, Seneca Avenue improvement bonds no 843, 846, and 847, Lateral sewer bonds no 74, 75, 76, 77, 78, 79, 1059 and 1060 and the costs incident hereto. All of said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of six per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, and principal and interest payable when due at the office of the City Treasurer of the City of Alliance, Ohio. said bonds shall express on their face the purpose for which they are issued, and under what Ordinance, said bonds shall be signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the Clerk of this City under the corporate seal of this City and shall be numbered and sold in the manner provided by law for the sale of municipal bonds, and the proceeds arising from the sale of said bonds shall be applied to the payment of the above described indebtedness and to no other purpose whatsoever.

An Ordinance to construct Lateral sewer No 24.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the City of Alliance, Stark County, Ohio.

Sec 1st. That the construction of sewer No. 24 be proceeded with in accordance with the resolution to construct the same adopted May 10th, 1897, by excavating and laying the necessary tile, according to the plans and specifications for the same now on file in the office of the City Engineer along the following alleys of said City, commencing at the intersection of the first alley north of Broadway and the first alley west of Liberty streets thence south along said alley to the north line of Broadway. Also commencing at the intersection of the first alley north of Broadway and Arch streets, thence east along said alley to Freedom street.

Sec 2^d. The cost and expense of said improvement shall be assessed per front foot upon the lots and lands abutting upon that portion of the said alley in which said sewers are constructed and said assessment shall be payable in three annual installments and bonds shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of said assessments.

Sec 3^d. That all of said lots and lands to be assessed for the construction of said sewer are in need of local drainage and none of them are now provided with the same.

Sec 4th. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

An Ordinance to issue Bonds for Sewer purposes. (No 24)

Sec 1. Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio, that to provide a fund for the immediate payment of the cost and expense of constructing lateral sewer No 24, in accordance with an ordinance passed June 7-1897, and in anticipation of the collection of a special assessment upon the property abutting on said sewer, the Mayor and Clerk are hereby authorized to issue the Bonds of said City of Alliance, Ohio, in the sum of nine hundred dollars as hereinafter provided.

Sec 2. That said bonds shall be in denominations of three hundred dollars each, shall bear date of August 10th 1897, and shall become due and payable as follows;

Three hundred dollars in one year;

Three hundred dollars in two years and

Three hundred dollars in three years from date of issue.

Said bonds shall bear interest at the rate of six per cent per annum, payable semiannually, and the several installments of interest shall be evidenced by coupons attached to said bonds, and both principal and interest shall be payable when due at the Office of the City Treasurer of Alliance, Ohio.

Said bonds shall be designated as Lateral Sewer bonds, and shall express on their face the purpose for which they are issued, and that they are issued under and in pursuance of this Ordinance, and shall be signed by the Mayor, and countersigned by the Clerk of said City under the corporate seal of said City.

Sec 3. That upon the sale of said bonds the proceeds thereof shall be placed in the treasury to the credit of the Lateral Sewer fund, and be used and applied to the payment of the cost and expense of constructing said lateral sewer and to no other purpose whatsoever; and the said special assessments and all portions thereof in anticipation of which said bonds are issued, shall, when collected, be paid into the Lateral Sewer fund and be applied to the payment of said bonds and the interest thereon and to no other purpose whatsoever.

Sec 4. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and legal publication.

An Ordinance to establish the grade on Prospect street from the east curb line of Union Avenue, to the west curb line of Mechanic Avenue.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio, that the grade of Prospect street from the east curb line of Union Avenue to the west curb line of Mechanic Avenue, be, and the same is hereby established as follows:

Commencing at the southeast curb corner of Union Avenue and Prospect street, at an elevation of 92.60, thence eastwardly along the south curb line of Prospect street and ascending at a uniform rate of $1\frac{33}{1000}$ feet per 100 feet for a distance of 150 feet to an elevation of 94.60. thence eastwardly and ascending at a uniform rate of 1 foot per 100 feet for a distance of 125 feet to an elevation of 95.85; thence eastwardly and descending at a uniform rate of $0\frac{615}{1000}$ feet per 100 feet, for a distance of 138 feet to the west curb line of Park Avenue at an elevation of 95.00, thence eastwardly and level to the east curb line of Park Avenue at an elevation of 95.00; thence eastwardly and descending at a uniform rate of $1\frac{620}{1000}$ feet per 100 feet for a distance of 414 feet to the southwest curb corner of Mechanic Avenue and Prospect street at an elevation of 88.00.

The north curb line to conform to the south curb line as nearly as intersecting grades will admit.

All elevations are in reference to and conform to the city datum plane as established by Ordinance.

Section 2. All Ordinances inconsistent with section 1 of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and legal publication.

An Ordinance to establish the grade on Rosenbury street from Arch Avenue to Union Avenue.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio, that the grade on Rosenbury street be and the same is hereby established as follows;

Section 1, Commencing at the southeast curb corner of Arch Avenue and Rosenbury street at an elevation of 161.10; thence westwardly and descending at a uniform rate of 1.74 feet per 100 feet for a distance of 293 feet to the west line of a 10 foot alley at an elevation of 156; thence westwardly and descending at a uniform rate of 1.31 feet per 100 feet for a distance of 190 feet to the west line of a 10-foot alley, at an elevation of 153.50; thence westwardly and descending at a uniform rate of 0.48 feet per 100 feet for a distance of 145 feet to the west line of a 10-foot alley, at an elevation of 152.80; thence westwardly and ascending at a uniform rate of 2.32 feet per 100 feet for a distance of 159 feet to the centre of the L. B. A. & S. R. R., at an elevation of 156.50; thence westwardly and descending at a uniform rate of 3.79 feet per 100 feet for a distance of 124 feet to the east curb line of a 31 foot street, at an elevation of 151.80; thence level for a distance of 15 feet to the west curb line of a 31 foot street at an elevation of 151.80; thence ascending at a uniform rate of 0.38 feet per 100 feet for a distance of 286 feet to the east curb line of Union Avenue at an elevation of 152.80.

The north curb line conforming to the south curb as nearly as intersecting grades will admit. All elevations given are in reference to the City Bench Map as established by ordinance.

Section 2. All ordinances inconsistent with the above are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall go into effect and be in full force after its passage and legal publication.

An Ordinance to assess a special Tax for the Construction of Sanitary
Sewer No. 24.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the City of Alliance, Stark County,
Ohio, that to pay the cost and expense of extending the present sewer system in
said city by the construction of what is known as Lateral sewer No. 24.
Commencing at the intersection of the first alley north of Broadway and the
first alley west of Liberty street, thence south in said alley to the north line of
Broadway; also commencing at the intersection of the first alley north of
Broadway and Arch street, thence east along said alley to Freedom street, in
accordance with an Ordinance heretofore passed by said Council for the
construction of the same, and the estimate of the Engineer on file, there be
levied and assessed upon each front foot of the lots and lands abutting upon
said Lateral sewer, between the points aforesaid, which is hereby assessed the
sum of seventy five cents, it being determined by Council and hereby declared
that each of said lots and lands has been benefitted by said sewer on which
they abut in an amount equal to the sum hereby assessed for the same.
It is further declared by said Council that each and all of the lots and lands
hereby assessed need local drainage and are not provided therewith, and that the
amount hereby assessed against each of said lots or lands does not exceed the amount,
which in the opinion of this Council, would be required to construct an
ordinary street sewer or drain, of sufficient capacity to drain or sewer any
of said lots or lands.

The owners of the lots and lands upon each front foot of which said sum is
assessed shall pay the amount of their said assessment to the City Clerk as
follows: Twenty five cents per front foot on January 15th 1898; Twenty five cents per
front foot on January 15th 1899; Twenty five cents per front foot on January 15th 1900,
or be subject to interest and penalty as provided by law; and in case of
default of payment as herein provided, the Clerk is hereby directed to certify
any unpaid assessments to the County auditor to be placed upon the tax
duplicate for collection.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect when ten days shall
have elapsed from and after its passage and legal publication.

Sewer 19.- Commencing at a manhole at the intersection of the first alley south of and parallel to Oxford street and the first alley east of and parallel to Seneca Avenue, thence west along the first alley south of and parallel to Oxford street, to the first alley east of and parallel to Linden Avenue; thence north along the first alley east of and parallel to Linden Avenue to the first alley south of and parallel to Broadway; thence east along the first alley south of and parallel to Broadway to the center of Freedom Avenue.

Sewer 20.- Commencing at a manhole at the intersection of the first alley south of and parallel to Oxford street, and the first alley east of and parallel to Freedom Avenue, thence north along the first alley east of and parallel to Freedom Avenue to the first alley south of and parallel to Broadway; thence west along the first alley south of and parallel to Broadway to the center of Freedom Avenue.

Sewer 21.- Commencing at a manhole at the intersection of the first alley south of and parallel to High street and the first alley east of and parallel to Seneca Avenue, thence north along the first alley east of and parallel to Seneca Avenue to Broadway.

Sewer 26.- Commencing at a manhole at the intersection of South Webb Avenue and the first alley south of and parallel to Broadway, thence west along the first alley south of and parallel to Broadway to the first alley west of and parallel to Seneca Ave.

Sewer 19.- Commencing at a manhole at the intersection of the first alley south of and parallel to Oxford street and the first alley east of and parallel to Seneca Avenue, thence west along the first alley south of and parallel to Oxford street, to the first alley east of and parallel to Linden Avenue; thence north along the first alley east of and parallel to Linden Avenue, to the first alley south of and parallel to Broadway; thence east along the first alley south of and parallel to Broadway to the center of Freedom Avenue.

Sewer 20.- Commencing at a manhole at the intersection of the first alley south of and parallel to Oxford street, and the first alley east of and parallel to Freedom Avenue, thence north along the first alley east of and parallel to Freedom Avenue to the first alley south of and parallel to Broadway; thence west along the first alley south of and parallel to Broadway, to the center of Freedom Avenue.

Sewer 21.- Commencing at a manhole at the intersection of the first alley south of and parallel to High street and the first alley east of and parallel to Seneca Avenue, thence north along the first alley east of and parallel to Seneca Avenue to Broadway.

Sewer 23.- Commencing at a manhole at the intersection of the first alley east of and parallel to Seneca Avenue and the first alley south of and parallel to Market street; thence west along the first alley south of and parallel to Market street to the first alley west of and parallel to Arch Avenue.

Sewer 26.- Commencing at a manhole at the intersection of South Webb Avenue and the first alley south of and parallel to Broadway, thence west along the first alley south of and parallel to Broadway to the first alley west of and parallel to Seneca Av.

Sewer 28.- Commencing at a manhole at the intersection of the first alley north of and parallel to Oxford street and the first alley east of and parallel to Liberty Avenue, thence north along the first alley east of and parallel to Liberty Avenue to Broadway; and commencing at a manhole at the intersection of the first alley north of and parallel to Oxford street and the first alley east of and parallel to Liberty Avenue, thence south along the first alley east of and parallel to Liberty Avenue to the first alley south of and parallel to Summit street.

Sewer 29.- Commencing at a manhole at the intersection of South Webb Avenue and

the first alley south of and parallel to High street, thence west along the first alley south of and parallel to High street to the first alley west of and parallel to Seneca Avenue.

Section 2.- The cost and expense of said improvement shall be assessed per front foot upon the lots and lands abutting upon that portion of said streets and alleys in which said sewers are constructed, and said assessments shall be payable in three annual installments, and bonds shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of such assessments.

Section 3.- This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio, that it is hereby declared necessary that the present sewer system be extended by excavating and laying sewer pipes, according to plans, specifications and profile relating to the same now on file in the City Engineers Office, along the following streets and alleys:
 Sewer 32.- Commencing at a manhole at the intersection of Mechanic Avenue with the first alley north of Main street, thence west along the first alley north of and parallel to Main street, to the west side of Park Avenue.

Sewer 9.- Commencing at a manhole at the intersection of Mechanic Avenue and Prospect street, thence west in Prospect street to Union Ave, thence south in Union Avenue to Main street.

The cost and expense of said improvement shall be assessed per front foot upon the lots and lands abutting on said improvement according to the laws and ordinances on the subject of assessments, and shall be payable in three annual installments, and Bonds shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of such assessments.

Section 1.- That the construction of what is known as sewers Nos 9 and 32 be proceeded with in accordance with the resolution to construct the same adopted August 2^d, 1897, by excavating and laying the necessary tile, according to the plans and specifications now on file for the same in the City Engineers office, along the streets and alleys of said City.

Sewer No 9.- Commencing at a manhole at the intersection of Mechanic Avenue with Prospect street, thence west in Prospect street to Union Avenue, thence south in Union Avenue to Main street.

Sewer No 32.- Commencing at a manhole at the intersection of Mechanic Avenue with the first Alley north of Main street, thence west along the first Alley north of and parallel to Main street, to the west side of Park Avenue.

Section 2.- The cost and expense of said improvement shall be assessed per front foot upon the lots and lands abutting upon that portion of said streets and alleys in which said sewers are constructed, and said assessments shall be payable in three annual installments, and bonds shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of such assessments.

Section 3.- This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
