Mr. Morris also reported having had conference with solicitors in other cities which had been sued by Ira Jewell for alleged infringement of Mr. Jewell's patent on a central control for sewage beds. It was stated that seventy cities had been sued, seven of them in this section of the state.

Pike Street from Liberty Avenue to Franklin Avenue by grading and constructing stone or concrete sidewalks.
