The Womens Committee of the Council of National Defense of Alliance, Ohio, petition your honorable body for the use of a suitable street or streets for the purpose of operating a war market on the curb thereof; the street or streets to be so used to be barred from traffic only for the hours between 6 A. M. and 9 A. M., three days per week, namely Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday.
