The park Commission submitted the following report:

To the Honorable Council
of the City of Alliance, Ohio.

Gentlemen: We the members of the city park commission beg leave to submit the following recommendation:

Arrangement
for park
bonds.

(1.) That the Council proceed at once to make arrangements for the sale of the \$100,000 park bonds ratified by the citizens of Alliance, some months ago.

(2.) That the following tracts of land be procured, for park and play ground purposes by gift, purchase or condemnation proceedings:

(a.) The ravine west of Union avenue extending from Main street on the north to Oxford street on the south as per plans now preparing in the city engineer's office. We would also recommend the purchase of the tract north of West Main street now owned by W. G. Roller and Leroy Lamborn providing a price named is reasonable.

(b.) The Mahoning river tract east from the lands now owned by the city on south side of Mahoning river including the tract owned by the Webb heirs just west of the Webb street and bordering on the south side of the Mahoning river. Also the tract known as the Webb woods, in whole or in part.

(c.) Should there be sufficient funds remaining we recommend the purchase of either the Goat Hill tract or the tract at S. W. corner South street and Mahoning avenue known as the Ellett woods.
