

THURSDAY APRIL 4th, 1918.

Council met in adjourned session with President Barnard, In the chair.

The roll being called the following members answered to their names: Messrs. Grubb, Lower, Merts, James Miller, Penick, Weaver. Present 6, Absent 1.

Chief of the Fire Department J. E. Held addressed Council regarding the growing condition of the City and the condition of the present apparatus, that it is wearing out.

The matter was referred to the Fire Committee with the instructions to make full investigation of the existing conditions and report at an early date.

Mr. R. S. Koehler Secretary of the Manufacturers Association addressed Council stating that he had communicated with the Priority Commission of War Industry Board, Council of National Defense urging that priority orders be issued in regard to the City Water Works furnishing them supplies and orders that there may be no danger of the plant having to close down.

The City Auditor was instructed to communicate with the Priority Commission.

On motion of Grubb, seconded by James G. Miller, Harry Miller and L. L. Weaver were excused for non-attendance of previous meetings; which motion was agreed to.
