

MONDAY APRIL 22nd, 1918.

Council met in adjourned session with President Barnard in the chair.

The roll being called the following members answered to their names: Messrs. Grubb, Merts, Harry Miller, James Miller, Penick, Weaver. Present 6, Absent 1.

THE FOLLOWING ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS WERE INTRODUCED:

RESOLUTION NUMBER 44-A.

Res. 44-A read 1st time.

Mr. Merts: To issue a certificate of indebtedness to the City of Alliance, to reimburse the Health fund; was read the first time. Referred to the Finance Committee for immediate action. Grubb voted no.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 45-A.

Ord. 45-A read 1st time.

Mr. Merts: An Ordinance to make supplementary appropriations of the regular semi-annual appropriation ordinance; was read the first time. Referred to the Finance Committee for immediate action. Grubb voting no.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 47-A.

Ord. 47-A read 1st time.

Mr. Grubb: To vacate alley between A. D. Wallace Carriage shop and Warners Mill, (Houston Est.) from the north line of Prospect and south right-of-way of the Pennsylvania Company in the City of Alliance, County of Stark and State of Ohio; was read the first time. Referred to the Committee on Streets and alleys.

ORDINANCE MUNBER 46-A.

Ord. 46-A read 1st time.

Mr. Merts: An Ordinance to issue bonds for the purpose of purchasing an aerial hose and ladder truck and combination chemical pumping engine and hose wagon and necessary equipment therefor for the department. A police signal system with equipment and furnishings for same for the Police Department. Was read the first time. Referred to the Finance Committee for immediate action.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 48-A.

Ord. 48-A read 1st time.

Mr. Penick: An Ordinance to amend Section Two of Ordinance Number 2315 in so far as same applies to the rates, as set forth in Section Two of this Ordinance that are inconsistent and in conflict with Exhibit "A", referred to in Ordinance Number 2315; was read the first time. Referred to the Finance Committee.

On motion of Grubb, seconded by Harry Miller, Council referred back to the reports of the standing Committees.

F. E. Hartzell urges action against assess. J.J. Yochum files claim.

City Solicitor Shetler stated that F. E. Hartzell was urging councilmanic action regarding the assessment made against a lot and which subject has been before Council for some time.

He also called attention to the claim filed by J. J. Yochum and which was referred to the Mayor and Solicitor.

Mr. Shetler stated that Arthur Morgans cellar and his own had been flooded recently when a sewer became clogged. It was stated that Mr. Morgan had a valuable refrigerator damaged by the water. The subject was referred to the sewer committee and solicitor.

Need of arrange-ment to haul rubbish.

Merts called attention to the need of some arrangement whereby the rubbish in alleys could be hauled away. Said it was difficult to get teams and men and that when they were secured that the rates charged were very high. It was suggested that A. G. Tanner, who has charge of the city prisoners, working upon the streets, be authorized to haul the rubbish away and make a collection from the property owners, in this manner making his position self-supporting. Fire Chief Held said that he found trouble in getting business houses to clean up, those owing to their inability to get means of hauling away the rubbish.
