The following ordinance was introduced:

ORDINANCE 73-A.

Ord. 73-A read 1st time.

Mr. Merts: An ordinance fixing the salaries of certain employees in the Department of Public Safety, the Department of Public Service and the Auditor's Department. Was read the first time and referred to the Finance Committee for immediate action.

Grubb moved, seconded by J. G. Miller, that Council refer back to the reports of the standing committees.

The report of the Committee was agreed to.

Merts moved, seconded by J. G. Miller that the statutory rule requiring resolutions and ordinances to be read on three different meetings be suspended and the ordinance read the second and third time. The question being on the suspension of the rules the yeas and nays were taken and resulted in yeas 7, nays, none. Those who voted in the affirmative were Messrs: Grubb, Lower, Merts, H. Miller, J. G. Miller, Penick, Weaver. So the rules were suspended and the ordinance read the second and third time. The question being on the passage of the ordinance the yeas and nays were taken and resulted in yeas 7, nays, none. Those who voted in the affirmative were Messrs. Grubb, Lower, Merts, H. Miller, J. G. Miller, Penick, Weaver. So the ordinance was passed.

J. G. Miller reported progress on the park proposition.

Ord. 73-A referred back to Finance Committee.

A discussion rose that the salary of the Chief of Police as provided for in the ordinance just passed was unsatisfactory, and it was thot advisable to change same.

Merts moved, seconded by J. G. Miller that the vote on Ordinance 73-A as passed be re-considered.

The question being on the reconsideration of vote whereby Ordinance 73-A was passed, the yeas and nays were taken and resulted in yeas 7, nays none. Those who voted in the affirmative were Messrs. Grubb, Lower, Merts, H. Miller, J. G. Miller, Penick, Weaver. So the vote was re-considered.

The question being on the passage of Ordinance 73-A the yeas and nays were taken and resulted in yeas, none, nays 7. Those who voted in the affirmative were none; those who voted in the negative were 7. So the ordinance not having received the approval of the majority, was lost.

On motion of Penick, seconded by J. G. Miller, Ordinance 73-A was reported back to the Finance Committee for action.

On motion of Lower, seconded by Grubb, Council referred back to the report of the standing committees.

The Finance Committee submitted Ordinance 73-A and recommended its passage.
