

MONDAY JULY 22d, 1918.

Council met in adjourned session with President Barnard in the chair.

Water shortage on Waugh St.

Fred Curie residing at 424 East Waugh Street stated that during a greater part of the time he was unable to get water service at his home. He presented a list of the days during May when he was unable to get water.

The matter was referred to the Director of Public Service.

Water enters basement of City Hospital.

H. Miller stated that he had been to the City Hospital and that the Superintendent had reported that during a recent rain the water had entered the basement of the City Hospital to the depth of a foot. Also stated that the diet kitchen failed to keep food warm until it reached the patients.

Director of Safety Patton stated that the matter of the building was in the hands of the Hospital Commission. He stated that the building had been built too low.

Grubb stated that Tolerton had asked Council to grant permission to erect a porch at the block on Hester Avenue near Mechanic. The porch to be six feet wide and to extend over the sidewalk space, thus throwing the sidewalk nearer the curb. But Engineer Shidler had stopped the workmen as he deemed it a violation of the law. The City Solicitor was asked as to the legality of the procedure and he stated that the law did not permit the giving of sidewalk space for private porches.
