

MONDAY AUGUST 5th, 1918.

Council met in regular session with President Barnard in the chair. Roll being called the following members answered to their names: Messrs. Grubb, Lower, H. Miller, J.G. Miller, Penick, Weaver. Present 6, absent one. On motion of Grubb, seconded by H. Miller the reading of the minutes were dispensed with.

The following communication was received from the Trustees of the Sinking Fund: To the Honorable Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio.

Gentlemen: In pursuance to Section 5649-1 G. C. which provides as follows:

Communication from the Trustees of Sinking Fund.

In any taxing district, the taxing authority shall, within the limitations now prescribed by law, levy a tax sufficient to provide for sinking fund and interest purposes for all bonds issued by any political subdivision which tax shall be placed before and in preference to all other items, and for the full amount thereof. Interest and Sinking Fund for debt incurred after June 2, 1911 without vote of people-----\$38,122.27 Interest and Sinking Fund for debt incurred after June 2, 1911 by vote of the people----- 9,684.64 Interest and Sinking Fund incurred prior to June 2, 1911----- 35,292.91 Total-----\$83,099.82

Petition for sidewalks on S. Union Ave.

The following petition was presented to Council:

To the Members of the City Council, Alliance, Ohio:

Residents desire better water service.

The undersigned householders and residents of the City of Alliance, Ohio, and residing at the address following their names respectively petition the above City Council to take such action as necessary to require the proper officials in charge of the Water Works Department to improve or extend the service of water supply so that we have reasonable and equitable use of the same as is given to other residents of this city.

Our reasons for making this petition and calling to your official attention the above matter is because we have not had proper service as is given to other residents of the city. If this request is refused it may be necessary to file an action against certain officials for a mandatory injunction, all of which is unnecessary if action is taken in the matter as should be taken:

No Parking on Market Street objected to.

Mr. C. V. Goddard addressed Council regarding parking of automobiles on East Market Street between Linden and Freedom Avenues. Mr. Goddard was informed it was not the purpose to prevent citizens from stopping in front of the business places to load and unload goods.

On motion of Grubb the Auditor was instructed to notify the Police Department to look up and familiarize themselves with auto parking laws of the state.

W.E. Jitney desire stopping place on Main St.

R. W. Dunn, proprietor of the West End Jitney Line stated that he was unable to have a stopping place on East Main Street, east of Liberty Avenue.

Councilman Harry Miller stated that the question was one for the Safety Director to decide.

Mr. Lower: An ordinance to accept the plat of Rockhill Allotment of part of Outlot 25 in the City of Alliance.
Was read the second time.

Gas. & Power Co. refund 1 yrs. service.

J. G. Miller reported that the council committee and Solicitor had met with the manager of the Alliance Gas & Power Co. relative to the supply of light to residents where it was alleged that the price charged for running wires into the residences were exorbitant. The Company had agreed to pay back one years service.
It was recommended that the Solicitor take the case up with the Public Utility Commission.

Curb Growers Market.

Lower reported that three huckster had products for sale at the Curb Market open last Saturday on the Ramsey lot on South Seneca Avenue. Several growers reported that they have not been able to produce many products for the market.

Ord. 86-A. introduced.

The following ordinances were introduced:
ORDINANCE 86-A.
Mr. Lower: An ordinance to fix the salary of the janitor.
Was read the first time and referred to the Finance Committee.

Ord. 83-A. read 1st time.

ORDINANCE 83-A.
Mr. J. G. Miller: Determining to proceed with the improvement of South Arch Avenue by constructing an extension of Sanitary Sewer No. 38.
Was read the first time and referred to the Sewer Committee.

Ord. 84-A. read 1st time

ORDINANCE 84-A.
Mr. J. G. Miller: Determining to proceed with the improvement of Alley south of Patterson Street from Oak Street to Elm Street by constructing Sanitary Sewer No. 172.
Was read the first time and referred to the Sewer Committee.

Ord. 85-A. read 2d time.

ORDINANCE 85-A.
Mr. J. G. Miller: Determining to proceed with the improvement of Perry Street from Alley west of Diehl Court to Garfield Avenue, by constructing an extension to Sanitary Sewer No. 153.
Was read the second time and referred to the Sewer Committee.

Sidewalks desired on N. Arch Ave.

On motion the annual budget was referred to the Finance Committee.
On motion of Grubb the Engineer was instructed to prepare resolutions for the construction of sidewalks on North Arch Avenue from the first Alley north of Main Street to Hester Avenue.

Wish weeds on Lane lot to be removed.

Penick stated that the south side citizens desired the weeds on the Lane lot on Vincent Street cut, as the city had done its part on removing weeds.

Awnings on Main St. Signs at St. intersections

Lower called attention to the fact that a number of awnings in Main Street were only five feet above the sidewalk and people bumped their heads against them. He also called attention to the needs of a watchman at the gates of the N.Y.C. R.R. on Main Street.
Also the traffic signs be placed at a number of street intersections. He believed that the city should place signs at all prominent street intersections.

To remedy acoustics in councilroom.

Judge Moore submitted samples of lineoleum and suggested it be used on the Council Chamber and Courtroom floor.
On motion of Lower, seconded by H. Miller the Judge was instructed to go ahead and have the floor covered with the lineoleum.

Water sprinkling laws.

On motion of Lower, seconded by H. Miller the Auditor was instructed to call attention to the Chief of Police to the ordinance regulating the sprinkling of water.

On motion of Grubb, seconded by H. Miller, Council adjourned.
