

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 10th, 1918.

Council met in adjourned session with President Barnard in the chair. The roll being called the following members answered to their names: Messrs. Grubb, Lower, H. Miller, J. Miller, Penick and Weaver. Present 6, absent one.

E. D. Bair presents resignation.

Earl D. Bair, Clerk of Municiple Court, presented to Council his resignation to take effect September 30th, 1918. On motion of Grubb, seconded by J. G. Miller the resignation was referred to Judge Moore of the Municiple Court.

Lower presents communication from Baers of Canton.

Mr. Lower presented to Council communication from Baers of Canton, Ohio, providing a dicto-mimeograph which had been placed with the Chief of Police Hawkins on trial. They were asking a disposition of same. The matter was referred to the Director of Public Safety.

The following communication was read to Council:

To the City Council, Alliance, Ohio.

Gentlemen:

Communication from U. S. Housing Corp. read to Council.

Inasmuch as the United States Housing Corporation has taken over a certain tract of real estate, being a part of the Parkside Homes Allotment, which is outside the corporate limits of Alliance, for the purpose of constructing houses to house the industrial workers engaged in the shops of Alliance, and

Inasmuch as the said corporation proposes to construct water mains and pipes through and along Vine Street, from the center of Rockhill Avenue to the center of Meadowbrook Avenue; along Rockhill Avenue, from the center of Vine Street to the center of Fairfield Road; along Meadowbrook Avenue, from the center of Vine Street to a point One Hundred and Thirty-five (135) feet North of Fairfield Road; along Fairfield Road, from the center of Meadowbrook Avenue to the center of Rockhill Avenue; along Ridgefield Avenue, from the center of Fairfield Road to a point one Hundred and Thirty five (135) feet North of said center and to a point One Hundred and Sixty (160) feet South of said center, in said , in said Allotment, so as to afford adequate water facilities to such houses, and

Inasmuch as said corporation desires to connect and contemplates connecting these lines with the water system of the City of Alliance, and to secure a proper water supply from said City to serve the tenants of said Houses as consumers of water through the water system of Alliance,

Therefore, the United States Housing Corporation requests that the City Council of Alliance, by resolution, authorizing the Director of Public Service of said City, as the proper officer of its Water Works, to superintend and supervise the laying and extension of such water mains and water pipes in the streets above mentioned

RESOLUTION NO.99-A.

Res. 99-A. read to Council.

WHEREAS the United States Housing Corporation has taken over a certian tract of real estate in Parkside Home Allotment, in Lexington Township, Stark County, Ohio. and

Whereas said corporation proposes to construct water mains in said Allotment as follows: Along Vine Street, from the center of Rockhill Avenue to the center of Meadowbrook Avenue; along Rockhill Avenue, from the center of Vine Street to the center of Fairfield Road; along Meadowbrook Avenue, from the center of Vine Street to a point One Hundred and Thirty-Five (135) feet North of Fairfield Road; along Fairfield Road, from the center of Meadowbrook Avenue to the center of Rockhill Avenue; along Ridgefield Avenue, from the center of Fairfield Road to a point One Hundred and Thirty-five (135) feet North of said center and to a point One Hundred and Sixty (160) feet South of said center, and

WHEREAS said corporation desires to connect said water mains with the water mains of the City Water Works system of the City of Alliance, at or near the intersection of Vine Street and Rockhill Avenue, and

U.S.H.Corp. requests Council to lay Water Mains in New Housing Dist.

WHEREAS said Corporation has requested the City Council of Alliance to authorize the Director of Public Service of said City of Alliance, as the proper officer of its Water Works, to assist in superintending and supervising the laying and extension of such water mains and water pipes in the streets hereinbefore mentioned,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of Alliance, Ohio, as the proper officer of its Water Works, be and he is hereby authorized to superintend and supervise the laying and extension of such mains and water pipes in the streets hereinbefore mentioned.

Was read the first time and referred to the Water Committee for immediate action.

ORDINANCE NO. 98-A.

Ord.98-A read first time & referred to Fin. Com.

To provide for the issuing of General Street Improvement bonds of the City of Alliance, State of Ohio, to pay the said City's part of the cost and expense of the improvement of certain streets and alleys by grading, curbing, flagging, and paving and by constructing sanitary and storm water sewers therein.

Was read the first time and referred to the Finance Committee.

On motion of Grubb, seconded by Lower Council referred back to the fourth order of business the reports of the standing committees.

Wat. Com. rec. pass. of R. 99-A.

The Water Committee, to whom was referred Resolution 99-A, referred back and recommended its passage.

Miller, Penick and Weaver. The Rules were suspended and the ordinance read the second and third time. The question being on the passage of the Resolution the yeas and nays were taken and resulted in yeas 6, nays, none. Those who voted in the affirmative were Messrs. Grubb, Lower, J. Miller, H. Miller, Penick and Weaver. So the Resolution was passed.

R. M Scranton adressed C. on the annexation question.

Mr. R. M. Scranton adressed Council on the proposed annexation of certain territory to the City of Alliance.

Low place in S. E. Tracks.

J. G. Miller called Council's attention to a low place in the pavement of the Stark Electric tracks at Arch Street and Main Street. Also, spoke of the need of the sidewalk being repaired at the Roller Property formerly the Lamborn Property on West Main Street.
