

MONDAY OCTOBER 21st, 1918.

Council met pursuant to adjournment with President Barnard in the chair. Roll being called the following members answered to their names: Messrs. Mertz, Lower, H. Miller, J. Miller, Penick and Weaver. Present 6, absent, One. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Miss Elsie H. Whittingham, Court Stenographer, of the Municipal Court, addressed a letter to the chairman of the Finance Committee asking for an increase in salary. The letter was accepted and ordered filed.

At the request of J.G. Miller, F. L. Mowry of the Stark Electric Railway Service Director McConnell, City Solicitor Sheller, and Councilman Lower made a trip over the road of the local street car lines for the purpose of establishing stop plan of eliminating several stops. The list contains the following stops in the City of Alliance: Forest Avenue on the Summit Street Line, Seneca Avenue on the Main Street Line, Market Street, High Street, Summit Street, Grant Street, Twelfth Street, on the South Arch Avenue Line, with a new stop established between Waugh Street and Carr Street. Watson Avenue on the State Street Line with a new stop established between Clark and Aultman Avenue and a stop between Shunk Avenue and stop 32. Prospect Street and Keystone Street on the North Union Avenue Line. Jefferson Street on the Vine Street Line with a new stop between Madison and Garfield Avenue. On motion the Solicitor was instructed to prepare a resolution making suggested changes and stops. On motion of Mertz, seconded by Penick the Solicitor was also instructed to prepare an Ordinance for cars to stop at the near side of the streets instead of the far side, as is done at present.

The City Solicitor called attention to street assessments on North Union Avenue which suit had been started and asked for conference with the assessments Committee.

RESOLUTION NO. 114-A. Mr. Mertz: To issue a certificate of indebtedness of the City of Alliance, Ohio to reimburse the Public Safety Fund to meet the appropriations heretofore made by council. Was read the first time and referred to the Finance Committee for immediate action.
