

MONDAY DECEMBER 2ND, 1918.

Council met pursuant to adjournment with President Barnard in the chair. The roll being called the following members answered to their names: Messrs. Lower, Mertz, H. Miller, J. Miller, Penick, Weaver. Present 6, absent one. On motion of Penick, seconded by Mertz, the reading of the minutes were dispensed with.

Mertz stated that much complaint had come to him from various sources relating to the streets lights not burning regular. A light at McKinley Avenue and Cambridge Street had been reported out of service for fifteen nights. Director of Public Service McConnell stated that he had paid no light bills for street lights ince August, pending adjustment for outages. He stated that the Gas Company had offered a refund of \$61.70 for outages, during August, September and October. On motion of JG Miller the light bills were referred to the Finance Committee, Streets and Lights Committee and the City Solicitor for immediate consideration. On motion of Lower, the Safety Director was instructed to instruct the Police Department to note the outages of street lights and report these to the Committee.. A more complete report of outages is requested. Report should show the time the lights were out, street location, etc..
