Safety Director Patton stated that he was unable to get a meeting of the Hospital Commission in order to arrange to have installed a diet kitchen outfit, thereby patients on the upper floor of the City Hospital could be supplied with hot food. On motion of Lower, the Finance Committee was instructed to investigate regarding the matter of funds required.
