Mr. Lower: An ordinance authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract with engineers to prepare plans, specifications, and estimates for making additions, repairs, and enlargements to the Water Works System in the City of Alliance, Ohio, and to superintend and inspect the construction and erection of same. Was read the first time. Penick moved, seconded by H. Miller, that the statutory rule requiring ordinances and resolutions to be read on three different days be suspended and the ordinance be read the second and third time. The question being on the suspension of the rules the yeas and nays were taken and resulted yeas 7, nays, 0. Those who voted in the affirmative were Messrs. Grubb, Lower, Merts, H. Miller, J.
