Com. for league of Municipalities.

A communication was received and read to Council relating to the formation of a State League of Municipalities. Lower moved, seconded by Merts, that the chair appoint a Committee of three to investigate the proposition of forming a league of Municipalities. Which motion was agreed to. Thereupon the President appointed Messrs. Lower, Penick, and Weaver.

PETITION FOR PAVING.

NOTE: This petition should be signed in ink by the owners of the lots abutting on the street, that is, each person in whose name the title to the property is recorded, should sign, and the signer should set up not the house number but the lot number and the frontage of the same.

To the Council of the City of Alliance, State of Ohio:

Gentlemen:

We, the undersigned, being owners of the number of feet of property set opposite our names below and being three-fourths or more in interest of the owners of property abutting upon

Columbia Street between Lincoln Avenue and Rockhill Road.

respectfully petition your honorable board for an improvement of said street between the streets aforesaid by draining, grading, curbing, and paving with vitrified brick block and that the entire cost of said improvement except only such portions thereof as is by law chargeable against the municipality be assessed by the foot front upon the lots and lands bounding and abutting upon said COLUMBIA ST., between points aforesaid.

And the undersigned and each of them consent and request that said assessments be levied and collected without reference to the value of property of the subscribers hereto and waive all benefits of the statute limiting assessments to 33 1/3 per cent of the actual value of the property assessed, and hereby agree to pay the assessments as levied on their respective properties and all errors and technicalities that may arise in connection with said improvements except only such portions thereof as is by law chargeable against the municipality; said assessments to be payable in ten semi-annual installments proportioned to the whole assessments or in cash at the option of the owner of property assessed, in the manner provided by the law for the levy and collection of assessments.

of Standpipe

Mr. Grubb stated that several Miller Avenue citizens were complaining that the Mt. Union Avenue standpipe overflows and floods their cellars-a properties and puts water in their cellars. Supt. Stanley stated that he had been unable to find where Water had entered the cellars. Also that the engineers at the Water Works had no way of knowing when the stand pipe overflows. On motion of Grubb, the matter was referred to the Director of Public Service.
