

MONDAY APRIL 7th, 1919.

Council met in pursuance of adjournment with President Barnard in the chair. Roll being called the following members answered to their names: Messrs. Grubb, Lower, Merts, H. Miller, J. Miller, Weaver. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

On motion of Lower, seconded by Weaver, Penick was excused from non-attendance of this meeting on account of sickness.

Plumbing and Bldg. Code Ord.

City Solicitor Shetler advised the councilmen regarding the publication of the proposed building code and remodeled plumbing ordinance, jointly. The law requires the publication in the usual manner of the building code, the solicitor, stated, as it is strictly new legislation. A pamphlet publication of the plumbing ordinance, he said was sufficient.

A communication from Mr. Marshall was received regarding the remarks he had made at Council and that it was due to his having been misinformed and as it was an injustice he apologized to the two organizations, and to Council. The Communication was ordered filed.

Pres. Barnard stated that a letter of appreciation had been received from Mrs. Blanche W. Morris, widow of the late Attorney A. W. Morris, former City Solicitor, thanking council for the flowers sent at the time of the funeral.

Case of All. Cold Storage Co. vs. City.

Solicitor Shetler said that the case of the Alliance Cold Storage Co. against the city, for damages claimed as due owing to changes of grade in the erection of the Arch St. Subway, was scheduled for hearing this week. The Solicitor was authorized to effect a settlement if satisfactory terms could be secured.

Claim of City against Wm. Wilson.

City Auditor, Silver, called attention to a claim against Wm. Wilson administrator of the Estate of Sam Warner. The Solicitor was instructed to take the necessary steps to collect said claim.

Sidewalks in new allotments.

Service Director, McConnell, stated that Mr. Russell of the U. S. Housing Corporation has asked that the sidewalks and street paving in the new allotment be authorized at different widths from the established regulations for such improvements. A resolution covering the above was presented and referred to the Streets and Alleys Committee.

Solicitor Shetler stated that he had notified W. A. Thompson to remove from South Mechanic Avenue a garage which is said to occupy a portion of the street.

To The Honorable City Council, Alliance, Ohio,

Gentlemen:

We, the undersigned, being owners of property abutting on what is known as the Lamborn Run in the City of Alliance, Ohio, between the north line of the first alley south of Ely Street and west line of North Park Avenue in said City, do hereby petition your honorable Body to construct a brick storm sewer along said Run of sufficient size to properly sewer said Run.

If said request is granted, we hereby agree to pay into the City Treasury an amount sufficient to pay one-half the cost of said sewer except that part constructed on the Streets and Alleys of said City before the contract for the construction of the Storm Sewer is awarded.
