RESOLUTION 89-B.

Res. 89-B. introduced. Read 1st time.

Was read the first time and referred to the Special Gas Committee for immediate action.

Gas question discussed.

A discussion of the gas question, in which the merits of both natural and artificial gas was brought out, followed.

The following citizens were present and addressed Council: Mayor Westover, Charles Archer, H. B. Hazzard, P. C. Leist, R. M. Scranton, G. W. Henry, J. A. Farrell, and Jos. Kane representing the New Process Gas Co. of Pittsburgh.

Res. 89-B. passed.

Miller moved, seconded by Harry Miller that the statutory rule requiring ordinances and resolutions to be read on three different days be suspended and the resolution read the second and third time. The question being on the suspension of the rules the yeas and nays were taken and resulted, yeas 7, nays 0. Those who voted in the affirmative were Messrs. Grubb, Lower, Merts, H. Miller, J. G. Miller, Penick and Weaver. So the rules were suspended and the resolution read the second and third time.

The question being on the passage of the resolution the yeas and nays were taken and resulted, yeas 7, nays 0. Those who voted in the affirmative were Messrs. Grubb, Lower, Merts, J. G. Miller, H. Miller, Penick and Weaver. So the resolution was passed.

The following petition was presented to Council:

To the Council of the City of Alliance, State of Ohio:

Gentlemen:

Petition presented for the paving of Washington St.

We, the undersigned, being owners of the number of feet set opposite our names below and being three-fourths or more in interest of the owners of property abutting upon Washington Street between Union Avenue and Lincoln Avenue respectfully petition your Honorable Board for an improvement of said street between the points aforesaid, by draining, grading, curbing, and paving with brick block, and that the entire cost of said improvement except only such portions thereof as is by law chargeable against the municipality be assessed by the foot front upon the lots and lands bounding and abutting upon said Washington Street between points aforesaid.

And the undersigned and each of them consent and request that said assessments be levied and collected without reference to the value of the property of the subscribers hereto and waive all benefits of the statute limiting assessments to 33 1/3 per cent of the actual value of the property assessed, and hereby agree to pay the assessments as levied on their respective properties and waive all errors and technicalities that may arise in connection with said improvements and agree to pay the entire cost of said improvements except only such portions thereof as is by law chargeable against the municipality; said assessments to be payable in ten semi-annual installments proportioned to the whole assessment or in cash at the option of the owner of the property assessed, in the manner provided by the law for the levy and collection of assessments.
