

MONDAY JUNE 16, 1919

Council met pursuant to adjournment with President Barnard in the chair.

Avenue.

We, the undersigned, tax-payers and citizens of the City of Alliance, Ohio, residing in the vicinity of Freedom Avenue in said city, respectfully petition the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio, to take the necessary steps and pass the necessary legislation necessary to grade and drain Freedom Avenue from Carr's alley to College Street.

We represent to your honorable body that there are only a few streets in the City of Alliance that run from Main Street to State Street, and the only ones open and available for traffic at this time on either side of Freedom Avenue are Arch Street and Liberty, so that we feel that it is a public necessity that Freedom Avenue be opened up between Carr's alley and State Street, it being midway between Arch and Liberty Streets. The street is now improved as far as Carr's alley, and again from College Street to State Street, being paved from Walnut Street through to Waugh Street, and we believe that it is of immediate necessity that it should be improved and opened the balance of the way. We might state that this Street has been dedicated to public use for some time between the points mentioned, and that all it will take is the necessary grading and draining.

We sincerely trust that you will take immediate action on this matter.
