PETITION FOR VACATION OF CERTAIN STREETS AND ALLEYS IN THE CITY OF ALLIANCE, OHIO.

To the City Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio.

Gentlemen:

The undersigned, owner of all the lots and lands bounding and abutting on the streets and alleys hereinafter described and in the immediate vicinity thereof respectfully petitions your Honorable body to vacate the following streets and alleys in the City of Alliance, Ohio, to-wit:

Webb Avenue from the South lot line of Waugh Street to the North lot line of Devine Street.

Morgan Avenue from the South lot line of Waugh Street to the North lot line of the first alley South of Ohio Street.

Wade Avenue from the South lot line of Waugh Street to the North lot line of Devine Street.

Grace Street from the East lot line of Liberty Avenue to the West lot line of Woodland Avenue.

Devine Street from the East lot line of Liberty Avenue to the West lot line of Woodland Avenue.

The first alley West of Woodland Avenue from the South lot line of Waugh Street to the North lot line of Devine Street.

The first Alley West of Wade Avenue from the South lot line of Waugh Street to the North lot line of Devine Street.

The first alley South of Devine Street from a point One Hundred Fifty (150) feet East of the East lot line of Morgan Avenue to a point One hundred Fifty (150) feet West of the West lot line of Morgan Avenue.

The first alley East of Morgan Avenue from the South line of the first alley South of Devine Street to the north line of the first alley South of Ohio Street.

The first alley West of Morgan Avenue from the South line of the first alley South of Devine Street to the North line of the first alley South of Ohio Street.

The first West of Morgan Avenue from the South lot line of Waugh Street to the South lot line of Devine Street.

The First alley West of Webb Avenue from the South lot line of Waugh Street to the North lot line of Devine Street.

The first alley East of Liberty Avenue from the South lot line of Waugh street to the North lot line of Devine Street.

The first alley South of Waugh Street from the first alley East of Liberty Avenue to the first alley West of Webb Avenue.

The first alley South of Grace Street from the first alley East of Liberty Avenue to the first alley West of Webb Avenue.

The undersigned, your petitioner, further represents that the vacation of said streets and alleys will not be detrimental to the general interest for the reason that the undersigned is making a dedication of other public streets which serve the purpose of those, the vacation of which is hereby sought.
