INTRODUCTION OF ORDINANCES

Ordinance No. 45-C

Mr. Weaver:

An ordinance fixing the salaries of certain employees of various City Departments in the City of Alliance, Ohio, was read the first time and referred to the Finance Committee for immediate action.
