On motion of Lower, seconded by Weaver, the reading of the minutes was dispensed with.

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The following petition was presented to Council.

We, the undersigned employees of The Municipal Court of Alliance, Ohio, respectfully petition your honorable body to increase our salaries twenty-five per cent (25%).

Our salaries at the present figure are absurdly low, not in proportion with other salaries paid by the City, and not commensurate with the ability required to fill our respective offices. We believe that your honorable body, in keeping with the policy it has already established, will cheerfully grant this increase, and take this opportunity to thank you for this and past courtesies extended.

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The City Solicitor addressed Council regarding legal matters pertaining to his Department. The injunction which had been granted to the City by the East Ohio Gas Company for some time has caused the East Ohio Gas Company to take action in Court immediately, the Solicitor stated.

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Ryan moved seconded by H. Miller that the Solicitor be instructed to draw up a new Ordinance for the Washington Street improvement.

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On motion of Ryan seconded by Weaver, that it be the sense of Council that the assessments for all the street improvements hereafter be met in ten installments instead of five.

Ryan moved, seconded by H. T. Miller that the required frontage on all petitions for street improvements be 2/3 of the frontage instead of 3/4 as heretofore, which motion was agreed to.

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SECOND READING OF ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS.

Resolution No. 43-C

Mr. Ryan: Declaring it necessary to improve Harrison Street between Union and Gar-

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field by grading, draining, curbing, constructing sidewalks, and paving with brick block or bituminous macadam was read the second time.

## Resolution No. 39-C

Mr. Ryan: Declaring it necessary to improve N. Garfield Avenue between Wayne and Vine Streets by grading, constructing sidewalks, was read the second time.
