of Alliance, Ohio.

Gentlemen:

The Liberty-Manhattan Company, of Alliance, Ohio, own and operate a dry cleaning plant at the corner of Hester, Park and Harrison Streets in the City of Alliance, Ohio, and what is known as the Lamborn or Ryan Run, passes over the east side of their ground.

About two years ago you constructed a bridge or culvert across Harrison Street which directs the water of the run against the bank of their property so that it is gradually wearing the bank back and impairing their buildings.

We invite your investigation of this matter and ask that the stream be protected so as to avoid what must be the ultimate result if it is not done.

Your early attention to this matter is earnestly requested, as the Liberty-Manhattan Company will necessarily have to hold the City of Alliance responsible for any damage which they may entail by reason of the above facts.
