To regulate the running at large of chickens and other fowls in the City of Alliance, Ohio.

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio

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Ord. bk 5
Section 1.

That it shall be unlawful for any person, being the owner of, or having in their possession or contrroll, any chicken, pigeon or other fowls, to allow, suffer or permit such fowl or fowls to be at large upon or over any of the streets, avenues, alleys, lanes or commons within the City.

Section 2.

Any person or persons violating the provisions of Section 1, of this Ordinance shall, on conviction, be fined in any sum not exceeding Ten dollars (\$10.00)

Section 3.

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Declaring it necessary to improve E. College Street, between S. Arch Ave. and S. Liberty Ave., by grading & draining the same.

Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio, three-fourths of all members elected thereto concurring.

Section 1. That it is necessary to improve E. College Street from S. Arch Ave. to S. Liberty Ave., in the following manner, by grading and draining the same according to plans, profiles and specifications on file in office of City Engineer.

Section 2. That the grade of said street as improved shall be the grade established by ordinance passed Dec. 2, 1908, No. 637.

Section 3. That the plans, estimates, specifications and profiles of the proposed improvement heretofore prepared by the Engineer of the Dept. of Public Service and now on file in the office of said department be and the same are hereby approved.

Section 4. That the whole cost of said improvement less one-fiftieth thereof and the cost of intersection shall be assessed by the front frontage upon the following described lots and lands, to wit: All lots and lands bounding and abutting upon the proposed improvement, which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefited by said improvement; and the cost of said improvement shall include the expense of preliminary and other surveys, and of printing and publishing of notices, resolutions and ordinances required, and the serving of said notices and the cost of construction, together with interest on bonds or notes issued in anticipation of the collection of deferred assessments and all other necessary expenditures.

Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio, three fourths of all members elected thereto concurring,

Section 1.

Declaring it necessary to improve Offord street, between west line of Haines Ave. and the west line of Seneca by paving same.

Be it resolved by the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio, three-fourths of all members elected thereto concurring:

Section 1. That it is necessary to improve Offord street from west lot line of Haines to west lot line of Seneca in the following manner, pave same with brick or blocks and draining same.

Ordinance No 656.

To issue bonds for the purpose of reconstructing the over-head bridge at the intersection of East Oxford street and the L. E. A. & N. Railway.

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Alliance, State of Ohio, two-thirds of the members elected thereto concurring:

Section 1.

That it is deemed necessary by the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio, to issue and sell the bonds of said city in the sum of nine thousand, five hundred dollars for the purpose of reconstructing the overhead bridge at the intersection of E. Oxford street & the L. E. A. & N. Railway.

Section 2.

That the bonds of said city be issued in the sum of \$9,500.00 for the aforesaid purpose; each of said bonds to be in the denomination of \$500.00, and numbered consecutively from one to 19, and all payable on the 10th day of April 1929, and bearing interest at the rate of 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ percent per annum, payable semi-annually, evidenced by coupons attached thereto. said bonds shall be dated Apr. 10, 1909, and shall run for a period of 20 years, from said date; and said bonds shall be payable at the office of the City Treasurer, in the City of Alliance, State of Ohio.

Section 3.

Said bonds shall express upon their face the purpose for which they are issued and that they are issued in pursuance of this ordinance, and Section 2835, Revised Statutes of Ohio. They shall be prepared, issued and delivered under the direction of the finance committee of council and the city auditor, and shall be signed by the mayor of said city and by the city auditor, and sealed with the corporate seal of said city; and the interest coupons attached to said bonds shall be executed by the city auditor with his signature thereon, or he shall have his signature printed or lithographed thereon.

Section 4.

Said bonds shall be first offered at par and accrued interest to the trustees of the sinking fund in their official capacity, and if the Sinking Fund Trustees refuse to take any or all said bonds at par and interest, then said bonds not so taken shall be advertised for public sale and sold in the manner provided by law, but not for less than their par value and accrued interest.

Section 5.

The proceeds from the sale of bonds, except the premiums and accrued interest thereon, shall be placed in the city treasury to the credit of the Public Service fund and shall be disbursed upon proper vouchers for the aforesaid purpose and for no other purpose; and the premiums and accrued interest received from such sale shall be transferred to the trustees of the sinking fund to be

An ordinance to establish a grade on Cherry Ave., between E. State St and Harris St.

Section 1.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the city of Alliance, Ohio, that a grade be and the same is hereby established on Cherry Ave. between E. State St. and Harris St., as follows:

Beginning at the south curb line of E. State St. at an elevation of two hundred and nineteen and fifty hundredths feet (219.50) ft., thence south to the north curb line of Chestnut St., to an elevation of two hundred and twenty-one and thirty hundredths feet (221.30ft.), thence to the south curb line of Chestnut St. to an elevation of two hundred and twenty-one and ten hundredths feet (221.10 ft.), thence to the north curb line of Mill St. to an elevation of two hundred and twenty-two and ninety hundredths feet (222.90 ft.), thence to the south curb line of Mill St., to an elevation of two hundred and twenty-three and ten hundredths ft. (223.10 ft.), thence to the north line of an alley, to an elevation of two hundred and twenty three and ninety hundredths (223.90 ft.), thence to the south line of an alley to an elevation of two hundred and twenty-three (223.90 ft.), thence to the north curb line of Grubb St. to an elevation of two hundred and twenty-two and ten hundredths feet (222.10 ft), thence to the south curb line of Grubb St. to an elevation of two hundred and twenty-one and ninety hundredths feet (221.90 ft.), thence to the north curb line of Hively St. to an elevation of two hundred and nineteen and sixty hundredths feet (219.60 ft.), thence to the south curb line of Hively St. to an elevation of two hundred and nineteen and forty hundredth feet (219.40 ft.), thence to the north curb line of Conrad St. to an elevation of two hundred and seventeen feet (217.00 ft.), thence to the south curb line of Conrad ST. to an elevation of two hundred and seventeen feet (217.00 ft.), thence to the north curb line of Harris St. to an elevation of two hundred and twenty-five feet (225.00 ft.), thence to the south curb line of Harris St. to an elevation of two hundred and twenty-five feet (225.00 ft.).

An ordinance to establish a grade on S. Lincoln Ave., between W. Main St. and Glamorgan St.

Section 1.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the city of Alliance, Ohio, that a grade be and the same is hereby established on S. Lincoln Ave. between W. Main street and Glamorgan street as follows:

An ordinance to establish a uniform law and rule, and prescribing the manner in which sidewalks shall be constructed and laid.

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio, that all sidewalks laid on any street, alley or public grounds, in the city, shall be constructed and laid to conform to the following rules and specifications, unless otherwise provided by ordinance or resolution.

Section 1.

Where mentioned in this ordinance, the term "Lot Line" shall be understood to mean, that edge or line of the lot, bordering on a street or alley. The term "Curb Line", shall be understood to mean, the outside of the curb, or the boundary of the driveway. The term "Sidewalk", shall be understood to mean that part of the street lying between the lot line and the curb line, which is paved with stone, brick or cement, to be used as a foot path. The "Inside Edge" of the sidewalk, shall be understood to mean that part of the street, lying between the outside of the sidewalk and the curb line. The "Width" of a street or alley, shall be understood to mean, the distance across the street or alley, between the lot lines.

Section 2.

The distance between the curb line and the lot line, and the width of the sidewalk on the various streets, shall be as follows: On streets 30 feet wide and less than 40 feet wide, the distance between the curb and lot lines shall be 8 feet, and the sidewalk shall be not less than 4 feet wide. On streets 40 feet wide and less than 50 feet wide, the distance between the curb and lot lines, shall be 9 feet, and the sidewalks shall be not less than 5 feet wide. On streets 50 feet wide and less than 60 feet wide, the distance between the curb and the lot lines shall be 11 feet and the sidewalks shall be not less than 6 feet wide. On streets 60 feet wide and not less than 80 feet wide, the distance between the curb line and lot line shall be 13 feet and the sidewalks shall be not less than 6 feet wide.

Section 3.

All sidewalks shall be constructed of flagstone, brick, concrete, or some such suitable material, and shall be laid on a firm foundation of cinders, gravel, sand or other suitable material, having a depth of not less than 8 inches, with the inside of the walk laid to the lot line, and with all side slope or grade of about 4 per cent. Where sidewalks join each other or abut the curb, they must be brought to the same elevation, so that there will be no offset in the elevations where they come together.

Section 4.

Where permanent sidewalks have been laid, prior to the passage of this ordinance, and such walks do not conform to the specifications herein provided, the council may by resolution authorize new walks to be laid in line with the permanent sidewalks in the same block of lots. A "Block of Lots" being understood to mean, the lots lying between two nearest streets, two nearest alleys or a street and the nearest alley.

Section 5.

No building, fence, steps, terrace or other obstruction, shall be placed upon, or encroach upon any street, alley or sidewalk, and any such obstruction or encroachment, is hereby declared to be a nuisance, and may be by resolution of the Council removed or abated.

(c) An emergency fireman who has had three years experience in a regular paid fire department service shall receive at the rate of \$65.00 per month for the first month's service: \$67.50 for the second month's service: \$70.00 per month for the third month's service and thereafter until classified.

(d) A fireman who has had four years experience or more in the regular paid fire department service shall receive at the rate of \$70.00 per month during the period of probation; \$70.00 per month after being promoted to the second grade: \$70.00 per month on and after being promoted to the first grade.

Sect. 2.

Ten special firemen, who shall receive 75 cts. per hour for time spent in actual service at fires: 20 cts. per hour for the time spent in actual service at drill \$0 cts. for each false alarm responded to.

Sect. 3.

Emergency firemen who have had less than one year's experience in the regular paid fire department service shall receive at the rate of \$55.00 per month until classified.

Section 4.

Temporary firemen or linemen in case of extraordinary exigencies shall receive \$ 2.50 per day.
