

THURSDAY EVENING JULY 8th, 1920.

Council met in adjourned session with President Barnard in the chair.

The roll being called, the following members answered to their names: Messrs. Cary, Lower, H. T. Miller, J. H. Miller, Ryan, and Weaver. Present 6, absent 1.

Mr. McConnell stated that the New York Central was vacating the building now occupied by them at the corner of Mechanic and Main Sts. and it was desired to construct a small building at the northwest corner of Main St. for the shelter and protection of their watchman.

The matter was referred to the Railway and Telegraph Committee.

The committee on grades submitted Resolution No. 71-C and recommended its passage.

The report of the committee was agreed to.

Ryan moved seconded by H. T. Miller that the sum of \$600,000.00 be placed in Ordinance No. 98-C. The question being on agreeing to the motion, the yeas and nays were taken and resulted yeas 3, nays 3. Those who voted in the affirmative were Messrs. Cary, H. T. Miller and Ryan. Those who voted in the negative were Messrs. Lower, J. H. Miller and Weaver. Thereupon the President declared the motion lost.

Resolution No. 71-C

Declaring it necessary to improve 23rd Street between Miller Avenue and N. Y. C. R. R. by grading and constructing sidewalks was read the second time. Ryan moved seconded by J. H. Miller that the statutory rules requiring ordinances and resolutions to be read on three different days be suspended and Resolution No. 71-C be read the third time. The question being on the suspension of the rules, the yeas and nays were taken and resulted yeas 6, nays 0. Those who voted in the affirmative were Messrs. Cary, Lower, H. T. Miller, J. H. Miller, Ryan, and Weaver. So the rules were suspended and the Resolution read the third time. The question being on the passage of the Resolution, the yeas and nays were taken and resulted yeas 6, nays 0. Those who voted in the affirmative were Messrs. Cary, Lower, H. T. Miller, J. H. Miller, Ryan, and Weaver. So the Resolution was passed.
