Mr. Patton, Director of Public Safety reported that the complaint relating to pigeons running at large had been investigated and parties had promised to abate the nuisance.

To authorize the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract without advertising to repair the westville Reservoir and construct a water ditch was read the first time and referred to the Water Committee for immediate action.

Miller seconded by Ryan, the Engineer was instructed to prepare plans for storm sewer on Simpson Street also the matter of the sewer assessment on the Urig property on Vine Street was referred to the City Solicitor. Also the Engineer was instructed to prepare plans and specifications for a sewer connecting with the Lamborn Run to remedy the nuisance at the Manhattan Cleaning Establishment.

On motion of H. T. Miller seconded by Ryan, the Service Director was instructed to close Hazel Street until same can be repaired.

H. T. Miller moved seconded by Cary that the Director of Public Safety be instructed to secure the motorcycle now in the Fire Department, repair same and put it in use for the Police Department. The question being on agreeing to the motion, the yeas and nays were taken and resulted yeas 1, nays 5. Those who voted in the affirmative were Messrs. Cary. Those who voted in the negative were Messrs. Hall, Lower, H. T. Miller, Ryan, and weaver. So the motion was disagreed to.

On motion of Lower, seconded by H. T. Miller, Council referred back to the reports of standing committees.
