Introduction of Ordinance No. 113-C

Mr. Ryan: An ordinance granting to the Stark Electric R. R. Co., a Corporation its successors and assigns the right to charge certain fares, cash and by sale of tickets on its city lines and interurban lines within the limits of the city of Alliance, Stark County, Ohio, describing the terms and conditions thereof was read the first time.
