Dear Sir:

Your favor of November 9th addressed to the Ohio State Armory Board at hand.

The Armory Board was abolished by law several years ago and the Adjutant General is now Director of State Armories. As such, I have no authority to deed back to anyone real estate that has heretofore been deeded to the State of Ohio. This will have to be done by special act of the legislature, giving me or the Governor authority to do so. I suggest that you take up the matter further with your representative or Senator in the new State Legislature.

I further suggest that you consider this matter carefully, as we are going to ask the incoming legislature to make a special appropriation to build armories. Of course as long as you have no unit of the new Ohio National Guard, no armory could be built in your city. We ought to have by all means a company or some unit of the National Guard in Alliance to succeed old Company K of the 8th Regiment. If you can recommend the names of two or three veterans of the World War, ex-officers preferred, that is men who have had experience, who might be interested in organizing a Company in your city, please let me know and I will be glad to take up the matter with them. Our progress in reorganizing the Guard has been very satisfactory and today we have nearly four thousand officers and men and are mustering in at least one company or unit per week.

under Sec. #3830 General Code, a claim for damages against the City of Alliance, Ohio, arising by reason of her injuries received from falling into an excavation in the sidewalk, just in front of the Cook Block on East Patterson Street.

At the time that our client received such injury we were advised by her that she believed she would recover completely therefrom; but now from the lapse of time she finds that the said injury is much more serious than she then so considered, and now believes the said injury to be permanent and that she will not recover the normal use of her limb.

Therefore, as the said claim filed on June 3, has been ignored, she hereby withdraws the said claim and herewith files her claim anew, and is asking damages in the sum of Five Thousand Dollars, (\$5000.00), by reason of her said injury proving to be permanent in character. If we shall hear nothing from the proper officers of the City within sixty days of the filing of this claim, we are instructed to file an action on behalf of our client seeking a judgment against the City for her injury in the amount above claimed.

PETITION FOR PAVING

NOTE: This petition should be signed in ink by the owner or owners of the lots abutting on the street, that is, each person in whose name the title to the property is recorded, should sign, and the signer should set up not the house number but the lot number and the frontage of the same.

TO THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLIANCE, STATE OF OHIO:

Gentlemen:

We, the undersigned, being the owners of the number of feet of property set opposite our names below and being three-fourths or more in interest of the owners of property abutting upon East Broadway Street between Union Avenue and Arch Avenue respectfully petition your Honorable Board for an improvement of said street between the points aforesaid by grading, draining, curbing and paving with vetrified brick block and that the entire cost of said improvement except only such portions thereof as is by law chargeable against the municipality be assessed by the foot front upon the lots and lands bounding and abutting upon said East Broadway Street between the points aforesaid.

And the undersigned and each of them consent and request that said assessments be levied and collected without reference to the value of the property of the subscribers hereto and waive all benefits of the statute limiting assessments to 33 1/3 per cent of the actual value of the property assessed, and hereby agree to pay the assessments as levied on their respective properties and waive all errors and technicalities that may arise in connection with said improvements and agree to pay the entire cost of said improvements except only such portions thereof as is by law chargeable against the municipality; said assessments to be payable in ten semi-annual installments proportioned to the whole assessment or in cash at the option of the owner of the property assessed, in the manner provided by law for the levy and collection of assessments.
