

Ordinance No. 1211.

An ordinance regulating drays, wagons, hackney coaches, omnibuses, automobiles, motorcycles, bicycles, power trucks, except street cars, upon the streets, alleys, avenues, and public places in the city of Alliance, Ohio.

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Alliance, O.:

- Section 1. The term vehicle as herein used shall include all drays, wagons, hackney coaches, omnibuses, automobiles, motorcycles, power trucks, carriages buggies, and other vehicles, except street cars.
- Section 2. The owner, operator, driver, or person in charge of any vehicle propelled or driven upon the streets, lanes, avenues, or public places of the city of Alliance, Ohio, shall conform to and observe the following regulations and rules of the road:
- Section 3. Vehicles shall be driven in a careful manner and with due regard to the safety and convenience of pedestrians; and all vehicles.
- Section 4. All vehicles meeting shall pass each other to the right.
- Section 5. Vehicles overtaken shall keep to the left of the vehicle which is overtaken, and in the case of automobiles and motor trucks shall, before passing, give a signal by the blowing of a horn or the ringing of a bell of their intention to do so.
- Section 6. Vehicles moving slowly keep as closely to the curb on the right, allowing more swiftly moving vehicles free passage to the left.
- Section 7. Drivers, or operators of vehicles, before turning, stopping or changing their course shall make sure that such movement can be made in safety.
- Section 8. Vehicles turning to the right in to another thoroughfare shall pass and turn the corner as near to the right hand curb as possible.
- Section 9. Vehicles turning to the left into another thoroughfare shall pass to the right of and beyond the center of the thoroughfare intersecting before turning.
- Section 10. Vehicles crossing from the side of a thoroughfare to the other side, shall do so by turning to the left so as to head in the same direction as the traffic on that side of the thoroughfare towards which the crossing is made. No crossing shall be made at the intersection of a thoroughfare.
- Section 11. No vehicle shall stop with its left side to the curb.
- Section 12. No vehicle shall be driven through processions excepting with the permission of a police officer, providing that nothing herein containing shall apply to any vehicles of the police or fire department or ambulance.
- Section 13. The driver or operator, of every ^{vehicle} when such vehicle is approaching a street car stopping for the purpose of taking on, or discharging passengers, shall give some signal plainly visible or audible to such passengers, and shall keep such vehicles at least six feet from the running board or lower step, the driver or operator

of such vehicle shall stop the same until such car shall have taken on or discharged its passengers and again started.

Section 14.

No vehicle shall stop any thoroughfare at greater distance than one foot from the curb over such a way as to obstruct free passage of the street.

Section 15.

No person under the age of sixteen years shall operator, drive or propel any automobile, or motorcycle on any thoroughfare in this city.

Section 16.

No vehicle shall remain backed up to the curb except it be actually loading or unloading as required.

Section 17.

The horse or horses or other animal power attached to any vehicle backed up to the curb, shall be turned at right angles to the vehicle and in the direction in which the traffic on that side of thoroughfare is moving.

Section 18.

Pedestrians shall have preference at street crossings, but they must not loiter in crossing the street.

Section 19.

The driver of any vehicle shall stop upon the signal of a police officer.

Section 20.

The police department shall have all powers and duties in relation to the management of the Vehicle traffic.

Section 21.

The police department shall see that this ordinance is posted in every public stable, automobile garage, and shall keep copies in the office of the Director of Public Safety to be issued upon application, and it shall be the duty of the owner or person in charge of any public stable or automobile garage to see that this ordinance is kept posted therein.

Section 22.

Drivers, or chauffeurs of any vehicle propelled by an electric motor, gasoline or steam engine on stopping such vehicle on a street, or public place, and leaving such vehicle, temporarily, or otherwise shall shut down or stop the motor or engine of such vehicle.

Section 23.

Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined not more than fifty dollars. (\$50.00), or imprisoned not more than (30) thirty days, or both, at the discretion of the Mayor of the Criminal Court.

Section 24.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances, inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 25.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Alliance, State of Ohio, to regulate billiards, pool etc,

Section 1.

That it shall be unlawful for the owner or keeper of a billiard or pool room, or the owner or keeper of a bowling alley, or any shooting alley or gallery or any owner or keeper of a billiard or pool table, bowling alley or shooting alley or gallery, in any public place, to permit or suffer any person to play at the game of billiards, pool, ninepins, tenpins, or any such table or alley, or to shoot in any such alley or gallery, on the Sabbath day, commonly called Sunday, or on other days of the week between the hours of 11:00 P.M. and 6:00 A.M. of the next day immediately following.

Section 2.

It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to play at the game of billiards or pool, or any other game of billiards or pool, or any other game which may be placed on pool or billiard tables, or on bowling alleys, or shoot in any place on the Sabbath day, commonly called Sunday, or any days of the week between the hours of 11:00 P.M. and 6:00 A.M. of the day next immediately following.

Section 3.

~~It shall be unlawful for the owner or keeper of any billiard or pool room, bowling alley, or shooting alley or gallery, to permit or suffer any gambling in connection with any game played therein.~~

Section 4.

Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall on conviction thereof be fined in any sum not to exceed (\$50.00) fifty dollars.

Section 5.

All ordinances inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed and this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

An ordinance regulating drays, wagons, hackney coaches, omnibuses, automobiles, motorcycles, bicycles, power trucks, except street cars, upon the streets, alleys, avenues, and public places in the City of Alliance, Ohio.

Be it ordained by the council of the City of Alliance, State of Ohio:

Section 1.

The term vehicle as herein used shall include all drays, wagons, hackney coaches, omnibuses, automobiles, motorcycles, bicycles, power trucks, carriages, buggies, and other vehicles, except street cars.

Section 2.

The owner, operator, driver, or person in charge of any vehicle propelled or driven upon the streets, lanes, avenues, or public places of the City of Alliance, Ohio shall conform to and observe the following regulations and rules of the road:

Section 3.

Vehicles shall be driven in a careful manner and with due regard to the safety and convenience of pedestrians and all vehicles.

Section 4.

All vehicles meeting shall pass each other to the right.

Section 5.

Vehicles overtaking shall keep to the left of the vehicle which is overtaken, and in the case of automobiles and motor trucks shall, before passing, give a signal by the blowing of a horn or the ringing of a bell of their intention to do so.

Section 6.

Vehicles moving slowly shall keep as closely to the curb on the right, allowing more swiftly moving vehicles free passage to the left.

Section 7.

Drivers or operators of vehicles before turning, stopping or changing their course shall make sure that such movement can be made in safety.

Section 8.

Vehicles turning to the right into another thoroughfare shall pass and turn the corner as far to the right hand curb as possible.

Section 9.

Vehicles turning to the left into another thoroughfare shall pass and turn the corner as near to center of the thoroughfare intersecting before turning.

No vehicle shall be driven through processions excepting with the permission of a police officer, providing that nothing herein contained shall apply to any vehicles of the police or fire department or ambulance.

Section 13.

The driver or operator of every vehicle when such vehicle is approaching a street car stopping for the purpose of taking on or discharging passengers, shall give some signal plainly visible or audible to such passengers, and shall keep such vehicles at least six feet from the running board or lower step of such car; and if either board or lower step of the presence of vehicles at the place where such car is stopping, or by reason of the narrowness of the street, it is not possible to preserve such distance from such running board or lower step, the driver or operator of such vehicle shall stop the same until such car shall have taken on or discharged its passengers, and again started.

No person under the age of sixteen years shall operate, drive or propel any automobile or motorcycle on any thoroughfare in this city.

Section 16.

No vehicle shall remain backed up to the curb except it be actually loading or unloading, and in such case not longer than the actual loading or unloading requires.

Section 17.

The horse or horses or other animal power attached to any vehicle backed up to the curb, shall be turned at right angles to the vehicle and in the and in the direction in which the traffic on that side of the thoroughfare is moving.

Section 18.

Pedestrians shall have preference at street crossings, but they must not loiter in crossing the street.

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Alliance, State of Ohio:

Section 1

That the assessment of the cost and expense of improving N. Union Ave. between Wayne St. & Vine St. by draining, curbing & paving the same with brick block as reported to Council on the 10th day of September 1910, be and the same is hereby confirmed; and that there be hereby levied and assessed upon the lots and land described in said report the several amounts as therein set forth. It is hereby determined and declared that each of said lots and lands are specially benefitted by said improvement, and in amounts equal to said assessment.

Section 2

That the total assessment against each lot shall be payable in cash within thirty days of the date of the final passage of this Ordinance, or in 5 annual installments with interest at the rate of 5% per annum upon deferred payments at the option of the owner. All cash payments shall be made to the City Treasurer. All installments of assessments shall be certified by the Clerk of Council to the County Auditor on or before the second Monday in September, annually, to be by him placed upon the tax duplicate & collected as other taxes are collected.

An ordinance regulating drays, wagons, hackney coaches, omnibuses, automobiles, motorcycles, bicycles, power trucks, except street cars, upon the streets, alleys, avenues, and public places in the city of Alliance, Ohio.

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Alliance, state of Ohio:

- Sec. 1. The term vehicle as herein used shall include all drays, wagons, hackney coaches, omnibuses, automobiles, motorcycles, power trucks, carriages, buggies, and other vehicles, except street cars.
- Sec. 2. The owner, operator, driver, or person in charge of any vehicle propelled or driven upon the streets, lanes, avenues, or public places of the city of Alliance, Ohio, shall conform to and observe the following regulations and rules of the road:
- Sec. 3. Vehicles shall be driven in a careful manner and with due regard to the safety and convenience of pedestrians and all vehicles.
- Sec. 4. All vehicles meeting shall pass each other to the right.
- Sec. 5. Vehicles overtaken shall keep to the left of the vehicle which is overtaken, and in the case of automobiles and motortrucks shall before passing, give a signal by the blowing of a horn or the ringing of a bell of their intention to do so.
- Sec. 6. Vehicles moving slowly shall keep as closely to the curb on the right, allowing more swiftly moving vehicles free passage to the left.
- Sec. 7. Drivers, or operators of vehicles, before turning, stopping or changing their course shall make sure that such movement can be made in safety.
- Sec. 8. Vehicles turning to the right into another thoroughfare shall pass and turn the corner as near to the right hand curb as possible.
- Sec. 9. Vehicles turning to the left into another thoroughfare shall pass to the right of and beyond the center of the thoroughfare intersecting before turning.
- Sec. 10. Vehicles crossing from the side of a thoroughfare to the other side, shall do so by turning to the left so as to head in the same direction as the traffic on that side of the thoroughfare towards which the crossing is made. No crossing shall be made at the intersection of a thoroughfare.
- Sec. 11. No vehicle shall stop with its left side to the curb.
- Sec. 12. No vehicle shall be driven through processions excepting with the permission of a police officer, providing that nothing herein containing shall apply to any vehicles of the police or fire department or ambulance.
- Sec. 13. The driver or operator, of every vehicle when such vehicle is approaching a street car stopping for the purpose of taking on or discharging passengers, shall give some signal plainly visible or audible to such passengers, and shall keep such vehicles at least six feet from the running board or lower step of such car; and if either board or lower step of the presence of vehicles the place where such car is stopping, or by reason of the narrowness of the street, it is not possible to reserve such distance from such running board or lower step, the driver or operator of such vehicle shall stop the same until such car shall have taken on or discharged its passengers and again started.
- Sec. 14. No vehicle shall stop any thoroughfare at greater distance than one foot from the curb or in such a way as to obstruct free passage of the street.
- Sec. 15. No person under the age of sixteen years shall operate, drive or propel any automobile or motorcycle on any thoroughfare in this city.
- Sec. 16. No vehicle shall remain backed up to the curb except it be actually loading or unloading, requires.
- Sec. 17. The horse or horses or other animal power attached to any vehicle backed up to the curb, shall be turned at right angles to the vehicle and in the direction in which the traffic on that side of the thoroughfare is moving.
- Sec. 18. Pedestrians shall have preference at street crossings, but they must not loiter in crossing the street.
- Sec. 19. The driver of any vehicle shall stop upon the signal of a police officer.
- Sec. 20. The police department shall have all powers and duties in relation to the management of vehicle traffic.
- Sec. 21. The police department shall see that this ordinance is posted in every public stable, automobile garage, and shall keep copies in the office of the Director of Public Safety to be issued upon application, and it shall be the duty of the owner or person in charge of any public stable or automobile garage to see that this ordinance is kept posted therein.
- Sec. 22. Drivers, or chaffeurs of any vehicle propelled by an electric motor, gasoline or steam engine on stopping such vehicle on a street, or public place, and leaving such vehicle, temporarily, or otherwise shall shut down or stop the motor or engine of such vehicle.
- Sec. 23. Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00), or imprisoned not more than thirty (30) days, or both, at the discretion of the Mayor of the Criminal Court.
- Sec. 24. All ordinances or parts of ordinances, inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance, are hereby repealed.
- Sec. 25. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Whereas, on the 17th day of April, 1911, The A.&A. Shortline Railway Company made application in writing, to the Council of the City of Alliance, state of Ohio, for the right to construct, maintain and operate an interurban railroad, over along and upon certain streets in the City of Alliance, State of Ohio, hereafter specially set forth, and notice of such application was duly published according to law, by the Clerk of Council.

Now therefore, be it ordained by the Council of the City of Alliance, State of Ohio.

- Sec. 1. That the said The A.&A Shortline R.R. Co., its successors, and assigns, and it is hereby granted the right and permission to construct, maintain, and operate a single track interurban railroad to be operated by electric or other motive power, except steam with the necessary poles, wires and all other necessary fixtures and apparatus, and with such switches, turn outs curves, loops, Y's, as the Council may hereafter grant permission to install, except such as are shown on drawings and blue prints hereto attached and to be approved by Council, over, along and upon the following streets in the City of Alliance, Ohio, viz: Harrison street from the West corporation line of the City of Alliance eastward to Hester avenue: on Hester avenue from the intersection of Harrison Avenue with Hester avenue to North Arch avenue, and from the north end of North Arch ave. where the same intersects with Hester Avenue southward to the intersection of Main street.
- Sec. 2. That the said The A.&A. Shortline R.R. Co., its successors, and assigns, shall construct and equip said railroad in the manner provided in the Section, and in accordance with the following terms and conditions:
- Sec. 1. Said interurban railroad shall be constructed with a single track of the gauge, and shall be laid as near the center of the street, over the entire route, as practicable. The rails used on paved streets to be of the latest and most improved design, and subject to the approval of Council. If said Company after ten days notice, shall neglect or refuse to do any work provided in this section, then the City shall have the right to do and perform all of said work and repair at the cost and expense of said Company, the amount of which cost and expense, if not paid, within ten days shall be collected from said Company, by civil action by said City against said company, its successors and assigns.
- Sec. 2. At the time of building said track and before cars are operated thereon, the said Company, its successors, and assigns shall fill or cause to be filled, between the rails and for a space of 18 inches on the outside of the rails, to the depth of 8 inches, with a bed of pounded stone, furnace slag, or other suitable material, so feathered out on each side of the track as to permit all vehicles readily to pass across said track at any point in the street, all of said work to be done to the satisfaction of the Director of Public service; provided that upon any improved street along which said railroad is constructed the road or paving material displaced in constructing said railroad shall be replaced by the said railroad, its successors or assigns, constructing said railroad, as the same previously existed, and the full approval of the Directors of Public Service and such filling and macadamizing between the rails and 18 inches on either side of the track shall be maintained by, and kept in good condition and repair during such term as the franchise for the construction of said railroad is granted.
- Sec. 3. The track shall be placed to the present surface grade on each street, and should a change be hereafter made in the grade of any of said street, the said The A.&A. Shortline R.R. Co., its successors, and assigns, shall make the same to conform to such changed grade when ordered to do so by the Council, with out receiving or being entitled to receive from said City, any compensation or damages, by reason of such change in grade.
- Sec. 4. The right to construct and operate said railroad shall include the right to erect poles and string trolley wires and such other wires and appliances as are proper and necessary for conducting electric current for propelling cars and maintaining lights, said poles shall be of wood or iron not less than twenty-five (25) feet in length, and straight, and shall be firmly set in the ground to a depth of at least four feet and as nearly vertical as possible. They shall be placed as nearly as possible 120 feet apart and be so located as not to interfere with ingress and egress to and from abutting property. The Council shall have the power and authority to change the location of any of said poles, and they may be temporarily moved when necessary, when any improvement or repairs are being made, Said poles shall be painted when erected and shall be repainted from time to time as the Council may deem proper. The wires herein mentioned, shall be provided with the latest improved appliances for the protection of life, and shall be so placed and constructed as not to interfere with the fire and the police alarm systems of the City. Whenever the Council shall grant permission to any person or Company to move any building or structure across the track or tracks of said railroad, the said Council hereby reserves the right to order the trolley wire and such other wires as may be necessary raised, temporarily, cut, or removed, for such reasonable time as may be required for the moving of said building or structure, across the track, and also the temporary removal of any poles for said purpose as may be reasonably required. The reasonable cost and expense of the raising, cutting or temporary removing said trolley, or other wires to accomplish the moving of such building, together with the moving of any pole or poles, shall be borne and paid by the person or Company upon whose request the same is done.
- Sec. 5. The cars to be used on said railroad shall be provided with all the latest improved appliances, for the comfort, protection, and safety of passengers, and employes. They shall be provided at at either end with suitable signal light, which shall be kept lighted when the cars are in use in the night time, and they shall be provided at the forward end of each car with a bell or gong, which bell or gong shall be sounded when approaching any street intersection, at a distance of one hundred (100) feet, from said intersection. Said cars shall be provided also with the latest improved fenders and safety guards, to the satisfaction of the Director of Public Service, And said cars shall not be run at a speed exceeding ten miles an hour within the city limits, and shall cross any intersections before stopping to receive or to discharge passengers.
- Sec. 6. The said A.&A. Shortline R.R. Company, its successors, and assigns, shall comply with any and all rules and regulations that may hereafter be adopted by the Council, touching the equipment and operation of said railroad.
- Sec. 7. The work shall begin on said railroad within six months, and shall continue without unnecessary delay until the said railroad is completed and in operation within two years from the passage of this ordinance.
- Sec. 8. Cars shall be running over said railroad at regular intervals and at least one car each way per hour shall be operated over said lines between the hours of six o'clock in the morning and ten o'clock in the evening. The members of the Police Department when in uniform shall have free transportation over said railroad, within the limits of said City.
- Sec. 9. Whenever the Council shall cause any part of any of said streets on which said railroad is constructed, and opened, to be paved, improved, or repaired, then the said The A.&A. Shortline R.R. Company, its successors and assigns, operating said railroad, shall pay so much of the cost and expense thereof as may be necessary to pave, repave, improve, or repair the space between the rails of the track or tracks, and for a distance of eighteen inches on the outside of each rail

and upon the same terms and conditions that may be prescribed for abutting property owners. The Council hereby reserves the right to specify the kind of track and road bed construction, rails, ties, ballast and draining, etc., both as to labor and materials that shall be used in such improvement, but on paved streets girder rails not less than nine (9) inches in height shall be laid; and it shall be the duty of said railroad Company, its successors, and assigns, to keep in proper repair and condition that portion of the street between the rails and for a distance of 18 onches on the outside of each rail, together with keeping in good repair and condition any devil-strip.

- Sec. 10. The said The A.&A. Shortline Railroad Company, its successors and assigns, shall at all times defend, keep harmless, and indemnify the City of Alliance from all damages, lawful claims and demands, for the injuries to persons or property, and cost and expenses to which said City may be subjected or may be made liable, by any proceeding by law or equity, or otherwise growing out of the granting of the privileges in the ordinance set forth, or out of the exercise or enjoyment of the same.
- Sec. 11. The franchise for building and operating said railroad on said streets, is hereby granted for the term of twenty (20) years, from the passage of this ordinance.
- Sec. 12. The said A.&A. shortline Railroad Company, its successors and assigns, shall furnish and pay to the city of Alliance, as hereinafter specified, an amount of money equal to twenty-five (25) per cent of the City's Portion of the cost and expense of the construction of a subway to abolish the grade crossing at the intersection of North Arch avenue and the Pittsburg Fort Wayne and Chicago Railroad, in said city, said amount of money to be applied for such purpose and no other. Said amount being hereby declared to be the reasonable proportion of the amount to be paid by the said city, for said purpose, that shall be borne and paid by the said A.&A. shortline Railway Company, except as hereinafter provided. Said amount shall be paid in monthly installments of five hundred dollars each, the first payment to be made during the month that the construction of said subway begins and five hundred dollars each and every month thereafter until the amount is fully paid. It is hereby further provided, that in case The A&A. Shortline Railway Company during the life of the franchise, shall make a traffic arrangement with any interurban Railroad, or any street Railroad, as provided by law, by which said Company or companies may use the tracks of the said A.&A. shortline Railway Company, shall pay to the City of Alliance, an additional 25 per cent of said cost and expense of said subway and to be paid whenever the said tracks commenced by the appropriateing Company.

Wayne & Chicago Railway, operated by the Pennsylvania Company, assignee of the Pennsylvania Railroad Company, Lessee, in the City of Alliance, State of Ohio, pursuant to the provisions of Sections 8874 to 8894, inclusive, of the General Code of Ohio, as amended by the act of the general Assembly passed May 10th, 1910 (101 Ohio Laws 377).

WHEREAS, the tracks of the Pittsburg, Fort Wayne & Chicago Railway, operated by the Pennsylvania Company, assignee of the Pennsylvania Company, Lessee, in the City of Alliance, State of Ohio, as now constructed, cross North Arch avenue at grade in said City and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the ordinance of the City of Alliance, No. 1259, passed August 21st, 1911, entitled "An ordinance to provide plans for the abolishment of the grade crossing at the intersection of North Arch avenue and the Pittsburg, Fort Wayne & Chicago Railway," the Pennsylvania Company, operating the Pittsburg, Fort Wayne & Chicago Railway, has cooperated with the City Engineer of the city of Alliance, in the preparation of the plans and specifications providing for the abolishment of said crossing as hereinafter provided; and

WHEREAS, said plans and specifications have been prepared and approved by said Railroad Company and City Engineer of said city, specifying the number, character and location of all piers and supports which are to be placed permanently in North Arch Avenue, specifying the grades to be established for the streets, and the height, character and estimated cost of bridge and street work including grading, paving, draining, curbing, and the relaying in kind of all sidewalks also the change required to be made in the Railroads Company tracks, including side tracks and switches, and providing for the abolishment of the grade crossing, and the necessary changes in grades of North Arch avenue, Patterson street, Prospect street and Hester Avenue (and Alleys);

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Alliance, State of Ohio, two thirds of the members thereto concurring, that:

- Sec. 1. It is necessary and the intention of this Council to abolish the grade crossing of the tracks of the Pittsburg, Fort Wayne & Chicago Railway at North Arch avenue, by separating the grades of said tracks and said avenue, as hereinafter provided, in accordance with the plans and specifications heretofore prepared and agreed upon by said Pennsylvania Company and City Engineer of the city of Alliance, pursuant to the provisions of Ordinance No. 1259, passed August 21st, 1911, entitled an "Ordinance to provide plans for the abolishment of grade crossings at the intersection of North Arch avenue and the Pittsburg & Ft. Wayne, & Chicago Railroad," which said plans have been submitted to this Council and are hereby approved and adopted, and are now on file in the office of the City Engineer of the City of Alliance, and pursuant to the following provisions, to-wit:
- Sec. 2. The said Pennsylvania Company shall be required to elevate the tracks of said Railroad between the points where said tracks intersect the tracks of the Cleveland & Pittsburg Railroad, to a point where said tracks intersect the tracks of the Lake Erie, Alliance & Wheeling Railroad Company, in accordance with said plans and specifications now on file in the office of the City Engineer of the City of Alliance, as approved by the Chief Engineer of said railroad company and the said City Engineer, and it is deemed and declared necessary that the Pittsburg, Fort Wayne & Chicago Railway, its lessess, successors and assigns, shall have the right to maintain masonry abutments at the street lines and columns or supports for the bridge over the street at the curb lines of North Arch avenue, at points and in a manner hereinafter described, and as shown upon and included in said plans and specifications, so long as the said Pittsburg, Fort Wayne & Chicago Railway Co., its lessess, successors and assigns, shall continue to operate and maintain said Railroad.
- Sec. 3. All material and labor necessary to complete that portion of the work within the limits of the Railroad company's right of way, including abutments, bridges supports, piers and excavations, shall be furnished and performed and paid for by said Railroad company, subject to the provisions hereinafter stated, except such material and labor necessary to change or lay sewers and water pipes, which work shall be performed and paid for by the City, subject to the provisions hereinafter stated. All work in connection with the improvements herein contemplated within the right of way of said railroad company, including raising of tracks, temporary supports of tracks, excavations, and building of abutments and retaining walls, shall be done by the Railroad company and the city of Alliance shall pay to the railroad company its proper proportion of the cost of said work as hereinbefore set forth, but the city of Alliance shall build sewers of every description, pavement, curb and sidewalks within said right of way. All work in connection with the improvements outside of said right of way, including building of retaining walls and sewers, relaying sidewalks excavations, changing water pipes, shall be done by the city of Alliance, and shall be done by the by the city of Alliance, and the Railroad company shall pay to the city of Alliance its proportion of the cost of said work as hereinbefore set forth.
- Sec. 4. Where the term "Clearance" is used, it shall mean the minimum vertical distance between the lowest point of the bridge overhead and any part of the roadway directly underneath located within a ten(10) foot strip taken symmetrically along the center line of said roadway.
- Sec. 5. Where the street is to be depressed, the amount of said depression shall be measured at the existing railway tracks at the center of the street and below the top of the railway rail. Vertical curves in the grade of the street shall be provided under the railway bridge and at the ends of the approaches.
- Sec. 6. At North Arch avenue the railroad tracks shall be elevated three(3) feet, and carried over the street on a bridge for four(4) tracks, having an opening of of Sixty (60) feetm measured at right angles to North Arch avenue, and supported by masonry abutments at the street lines and by columns at the curb lines. The street shall be depressed not to exceed sixteen(16) and seventy-five hundredths (16.75)feet. There shall be a clearance of at least fourteen(14) feet. The approach grade on North Arch avenue south to Main street shall not exceed six and thirty-nine hundredths per cent (6.39%) and shall extend to the north curb line of Main street. The approach grade east on prospect street from North Arch avenue shall extend to the east line of the alley east of north arch avenue, and shall not exceed four and twenty-six(4.26%) per cent. The approach grade west on Prospect street shall extend to the east curb line of Mechanic avenue, and shall not exceed four and sixteen hundredths (4.16%) per cent. The approach grade on North Arch avenue extending north, shall extend to the south line of Hester Avenue and shall not exceed three and twenty-nine hundredths per cent (3.29%). The approach grade on Patterson street east of North Arch avenue shall not exceed two per cent (2%). Patterson street west of North Arch avenue shall be vacated. At Freedom avenue the main tracks of said railroad shall be elevated two and one tenth(2.1) feet, and the side tracks north of the main

tracks shall be so elevated as to give the lightest grade possible between said main tracks the the present pavement of Freedom avenue South of the main tracks the grade of Freedom avenue shall be carried out level until it meets the existing grade. The approach grades on all alleys shall not exceed six per cent (6%).

Sec. 7. The grades of any and all streets which are affected by the construction of this subway in accordance with the provisions of this resolution, shall be changed so as to conform to the grades of said subway as they shall be depressed, and constructed pursuant to the provisions of this resolution and said plans and specifications.

Sec. 8. The cost and expense of said improvement shall be borne and paid for by said City and said said Railroad company in the proportion and manner following, To wit:-

(a) The City of Alliance shall pay to the said railroad Company thirty five per cent (35%) of the cost of the bridge, superstructure and substructure for four(4) tracks across North Arch avenue, also thirty-five per cent (35%) of the cost of building all necessary retaining walls, and thirty-five per cent (35%) of the cost of filling for and raising and rebuilding the existing tracks on the railroad company's right of way to the new elevation. The cost of the construction of Additional tracks, including filling therefor, shall be borne entirely by the Railroad Company.

(b) The city of Alliance shall also pay to the said Railroad company, thirty-five per cent (35%) of the cost of building all necessary retaining walls, thirty-five per cent (35%) of the cost of supporting four(4) tracks across North Arch street during the construction of the bridge

(c) The City of Alliance, Ohio, shall also pay to the said Railroad Company thirty-five per cent (35%) of the cost and expense of changing, relocating or adjusting the existing side tracks, switches or industrial track connections with said Railroad company to meet the change in grade in said Railroad company between the points covered by the Railroads Company right a way.

(d) The rialroad compay shall pay to the City of Alliance sixty-five per cent (65%) of the cost of material, labor, etc., in repairing sidewalks, retaining walls, building and rebuilding of sewers and relocating of water pipes, made necessary in carrying out the work herein specified.

(e) All other costs, damages and expenses of every kind, character and description, whether for temporary or for permanent construction, arising in the prosecution of the improvement herein contemplated, including damages, changes in grade of tracks and street constructions, excepting costs due to additional railroad facilities, shall be borne thirty-five per cent (35%) by the City of Alliance and sixty-five per cent (65%) by dsif Railroad Company.

(f) The estimates for all expenditures by the Railroad company must be approved by the City engineer of the City of Alliance, and the estimates for all expenditures by the city of Allince must be approved by the Chief Engineer of the said railroad company, before either shall be paid. Upon the payment of any such estimates, the party paying the same shall render to the other party a bill for the proportion payable by such other party, and all bills so rendered shall be paid within thirty (30) days.

Sec. 9. All general detail work and working plans made for the work herein provided, shall be approved by the City Engineer of said Alliance, and the Chief Engineer of said Railroad Company, in advance of any construction being begun or contracts let in connection with or based on said plans.

Sec. 10. The City of Alliance shall be permitted and authorized to build, maintain and repair all necessary sewer and water pipes across the right of way of the said Railroad company in and under the portions of streets herein provided to be vacated.

Sec. 11. All work to be done by the Railroad company under the provisions of this resolutions for which the City of Alliance is to pay part of the cost, shall be done except as provided below, by contract or force addount, to be approved by the city engineer of the city of Alliance before the work is commenced, apyments to be made upon such work by monthly estimates approved by the city Engineer of the city of Alliance and the Division Engineer of said Railroad Company, based upon said contracts or force accounts, within thirty(30) days of the rendering of said monthly estimates.

Where work is done by said Railroad Company's forces, on account of raising, maintaining and supporting tracks, installing bridges, and other wok of this character and where said Railroad Company shall furnish material for same, a detailed statement, certified by said Division Engineer shall be furnished to said City Engineer at the end of each month, showing the amount expended by said railroad company for labor and material, and a bill shall be rendered to the City of Alliance based on said statement, which shall be paid by said City of Alliance within thirty (30) days of the rendering of said bill.

upon the completion of the improvements provided for in this resolution, full payment of the amount to be paid by the City of Alliance to said Railroad Company shall be made with in thirty days from the completion of said improvement.

Sec. 12. All work to be done by the City of Alliance shall be done by contract or force account, said contract or force account to be approved by the Chief Engineer of the Railroad Company befor any work is commenced, payments to be made upon such work by monthly estimates approved by the City Engineer of Alliance and the Chief Engineer of the Railroad Company, based upon said contracts or fore accounts, within thirty(30) days of the rendering of the monthly estimates. If in the construction of any of such subways or approaches thereto, it shall be necessary to disturb, remove or destroy any pipes, trees, wires, conduits, etc, or any private property belonging to any private corporation or individual where the city or the Railroad company has contracts with the owners of said pipes, wires, conduits, or other property, which makes it necessary that the expenses of changing said pipes, wires, conduits, or other property shall be borne by the city of Alliance Ohio, or the Railroad Company, then all cost and expense thereof, and all claims for damages arising there from shall be a part of the cost of the track elevation work, and shall be borne thirty-five (35%) by the railroad company, and the city of Alliance will by the proper exercise and to the extent of its lawful powers, secure to said railroad Company the proper exercise and to the extent of its lawful powers, secure to said Railroad company the proper and uninterrupted right to prosecute the work, as herein provided.

If at any place or places on the line of said work, it shall be deemed by said Railroad company to be more economical or advantageous to change the plan of construction as hereinbefore set forth in any respect, or by purchasing land upon which to build the slopes or embankments instead of building retaining walls to hold such embankment in place, the said Railroad company, subject to the written approval of the City Engineer of the City of Alliance, may change said plan of construction or make the change and necessary purchases of land for that purpose, provided however, that such changes do not increase the total estimated cost of the improvement to the city of Alliance, nor increase the alterations in the grades of streets and other public places, as herein provided.
- Sec. 18. Said improvement shall be completed within one year from the passage and acceptance of the final ordinance herein.
- Sec. 19. In case, however, the said work or any portion thereof shall, without fault of said Railroad Company, be delayed for any time by reason of the obstruction of pipes, conduits, sewers, or other property of private individuals or corporations, or by reason of any strikes or litigations, or other unforeseen causes, then the time allowed for the construction of said work so delayed shall be extended accordingly.
- Sec. 20. The bridges for carrying the tracks of said Railroad company over North Arch avenue, as provided for, shall at all times be kept in good repair, and the said Railroad company shall save the said city of Alliance, harmless from any claims for damages by reason of any failure on the part of said Railroad company to keep the bridge in good condition and repair, In the reasonable care and unkeep of said bridges, the said Pennsylvania company, its successors and assigns, shall be subject to such lawful general ordinance as may be adopted by the city.

Said railroad company shall provide proper drainage, for its right of way, and shall have the right to make all necessary excavations in streets and connections with City sewers for that purpose subject to city ordinances and the rules and regulations of the department of Public service, relative to the making of such excavations and connections.
- Sec. 23. The city of Alliance shall not be liable for injuries to persons or property, caused or occasioned by the negligence of the City of Alliance or any of its officers or agents in the prosecutions of the work to be done by it, as herein provided.
- Sec. 24. The city of Alliance hereby declares its intention to make the improvement according to plans and specifications and agreements referred to herein, and the City Clerk, upon adoption of this resolution, be and is hereby authorized and directed to cause notice thereof to be given to the owner of each piece of property abutting on any street, highway or public place, the grade of which will be changed by said improvement, by serving upon each of such owners a true copy of this resolution, and causing due return thereof to be made in the manner provided by in section #3818 of the General Code for service and return of said notice.

All of the cost of the construction of such sewers, including the cost of inspection, Engineering and other necessary expenses incidental thereto shall be paid by the person or Association of persons making application for such connection, and before such application be approved by the Council there shall be filed with the Council a satisfactory bond in an amount not less than twice the estimated cost of the engineering, inspection and incidental expenses of the proposed sewer, as a guarantee that such expenses will be paid promptly when due and that the sewer will be constructed in accordance with the City's plans and specifications therefor.

On the completion of the construction of such sewers in the manner provided herein all records profiles, and measurements in connection there-with shall be filed with and become the property of the city and the Director of Public Service shall then authorize the person or persons having constructed same to connect with and use the city sewers and the records of such sewers shall shall then be kept in the same manner as for sewers within the city limits.

Provided further that in case of sewers that have been constructed wholly within the City no permit shall be issued for a house connection to property outside of the Corporation until the owner of such property shall pay to the City the sum of seventy-five cents (.75) cents

per foot for for the frontage of said property, provided that if such property does not abut on such sewer or has not been so plotted that a frontage can be determined then the frontage or which such payment shall be made shall be the actual width or frontage of the land on which such house or other building is located, but not to exceed fifty feet for each separate house or other connection drained into such sewer.

It is also provided hereby that the provisions of this ordinance shall be applicable to all connections that have been made to City Sewers prior to the passage hereof and that payment therefore as provided hereunder shall be made within thirty days after the passage hereof except that charges for sewer rentals shall not date back of the present calendar year.

All payments hereunder shall be credited to the Public Service Fund.

Mr. Geiger: Declaring it necessary to improve West College street, between Union avenue and Miller avenue, by grading, draining, curbing and paving.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio, three-fourths of all members elected thereto concurring:

- Sec. 1. That it is necessary to improve west College street, between Union avenue and Miller avenue, in the following manner: by grading, draining, curbing, and paving.
- Sec. 2. That the grade of said street as improved shall be the grade established by ordinance passed July 11th 1892.
- Sec. 3. That the plans, estimates, specifications, and profiles of the proposed improvement heretofore prepared by the Engineer of the Department of Public Service and now on file in the office of said department be and the same are hereby approved.
- Sec. 4. That the Whole cost of said improvement less one-fiftieth thereof and the cost of intersection shall be assessed in proportion to the benefits that may result from said improvement upon the following described lots and lands to wit: All lots and lands bounding and abutting upon the proposed improvement, which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefitted by said improvement; and the cost of said improvement shall include the expense of preliminary and other surveys, and of printing and publishing of notices, resolutions and ordinances required, and the serving of said notices and the cost of construction, together with interest on bonds or notes issued in anticipation of the collection of deferred assessments, and all other necessary expenditures.
- Sec. 5. That the assessments so to be levied shall be paid in five annual installments with interest on deferred payments at five per cent per annum; provided that the owner of any property assessed may at his option pay such assessments in cash within thirty days after the passage of the assessing ordinance, in which case said assessments shall not include any item of interest upon the bonds or notes to be issued in anticipation of the collection of deferred installments of assessments.
- Sec. 6. That the bonds or notes of the City of Alliance, Ohio, shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of assessments by installments and in amount equal thereto.
- Sec. 7. That the remainder of the entire cost of improvement, not specially assessed including the cost of intersections, together with the cost of any real estate or interest therein, purchased or appropriated, and the costs and expenses of any appropriation proceedings therefor, and the damages awarded any owner of adjoining lands and interest thereon, and the costs and expenses of any such award, shall be paid by the issuance of bonds in the manner provided by law.
