Ordinance 35-D

Ordinance 35-D lost

To appropriate \$600.00 from the fines collected and paid into the City Treasury for the violation of the law prohibiting the manufacturing and sale of intoxicating liquors to be used for the purpose of hiring attorneys, detectives and secret service officers to secure the enforcement of such prohibition laws was read the third time. The question being on the passage of the ordinance, the yeas and nays were taken and resulted yeas 3, nays 4. Those who voted in the affirmative were Messrs. Hall, J. H. Miller, and Weaver. Those who voted in the negative were Messrs. Cary, Lower, H. T. Miller, and Ryan. So the ordinance not having received the necessary majority vote was lost.

Ordinance 47-D

Passage of Ord. 47-D

To authorize an expenditure out of the contingent account of the General Fund for equipment for the police department was read the second time. Ryan moved seconded by J. H. Miller that the statutory rules requiring ordinances and resolutions to be read on three different days be suspended and Ordinance 47-D be read the third time. The question being on the suspension of the rules, the yeas and nays were taken and resulted yeas 7, nays 0. Those who voted in the affirmative were Messrs. Cary, Hall, Lower, J. H. Miller, H. T. Miller, Ryan, and Weaver. So the rules were suspended and the ordinance read the third time. The question being on the passage of the ordinance, the yeas and nays were taken and resulted yeas 7, nays 0. Those who voted in the affirmative were Messrs. Cary, Hall, Lower, J. H. Miller, H. T. The bid of Stacy & Braun Toledo, Ohio was conditional that they be awarded all the bonds or none.

Seasongood & Mayer, Cincinnati, Ohio bid as follows: For the \$54,000 out of the total authorized issue of \$102,000 we will pay par and \$110.00 premium provided we are granted an option at par and interest for sixty (60) days.

J. H. Miller moved seconded by Weaver that the bid of Stacy & Braun, Toledo, Ohio for the entire five issues be accepted and the bonds awarded to Stacy & Braun, same being the highest and best bid, which motion was agreed to.
