You recently served upon Mrs. Koehler a notice to improve West Cambridge Street by an asphalt top dressing similar to that on Union Avenue.

I have no objection to improving any street, but if the members of your counsel will either send the engineer, service director or some one on this street in the spring of the year or during any wet season, they will find that there is no foundation on practically all of this street. No matter what top dressing you put on, when a heavy truck passes over the street during the wet season, you will find that it will bulge. The street will never be any good unless it has a proper foundation.
