Petition

Whereas an ordinance has been passed prohibiting the parking of automobiles or vehicles on the south side of Main St. from Liberty St. east to the end of Main St. to the serious detriment of the places of business, we the undersigned business men of this restricted district and citizens of Alliance, hereby petition your Honorable body to repeal said ordinance and set forth the following reasons for so doing.

- 1 - Lack of sufficient parking space on the north side of the street.
- 2 - Damage to business on account of no parking space and driving patrons to other districts.
- 3 - No accidents having taken place in this district shows no serious congestion, recklessness nor dangerous conditions of traffic.
- 4 - There is sufficient space to drive between automobiles or vehicles parked near the curb and street cars standing or moving in the street.
- 5 - Two of our leading and largest Hotels is located on the corner of Main and Liberty and fronts on this restricted district.
- 6 - That we consider this unfair to the business men of this district and we have always believed in equal rights and that all available space should be used thus enlarging parking space instead of lessening it/
- 7 - That this ordinance is opposed by all fair minded citizens and should be repealed.

Business men present being interested in notice regarding signs on Main St.

Several business men were present being interested in a notice which has been served on each of the business men on Main Street calling attention to Ordinance 605, Section 2 which is as follows: "It shall be unlawful for any person to stick, post, or attach any advertisement, poster, sign, hand-bill or placard of any kind or description upon any electric light pole or upon any bridge or viaduct or across any street, alley or sidewalk within the limits of the city of Alliance."

Ask for modification of Ordinance

The business men present asked for a modification of this ordinance stating that thousands of dollars have been invested in electric signs which are now illuminating Main Street at night. Ryan moved seconded by H. T. Miller that a thirty day extension of time be allowed in which time Council was to investigate and if it be necessary, revise said ordinance.
