The roll being called, the following members answered to their names: Messrs. Cary, Hall, Lower, H. T. Miller, Ryan, and Weaver. Present 6, absent 1.

On motion of Ryan, seconded by Lower, the reading of the minutes was dispensed with.

Chief Held addresses Council regarding additional fire alarm boxes

Chief Held of the Fire Department addressed Council on the subject of additional fire alarm boxes for the new addition. Referred to the Fire and Patrol Committee.

Members excused.

Ryan moved seconded by H. T. Miller that Messrs. Hall, Lower, H. T. Miller, J. H. Miller and Weaver be excused from non-attendance at the last regular session of Council.

City Solicitor addresses Council on Broadway Improvement.

The City Solicitor addressed Council on the subject of the Broadway improvement, presented waivers, etc..

A gentlemen residing on Parkside Avenue addressed Council on the question of constructing four foot (4') sidewalks.
