An ordinance authorizing and directing the Director of Public Service to enter into contract for the purchase of a booster pump and motor and all fittings for the use of the Water Works Department was read the third time. An ordinance authorizing and directing the Director of Public Service to enter into contract for the purchase of Water meters for the use of the Alliance City Water Works was read the first time and referred to the Water committee and Finance Committee.

On motion of Ryan seconded by Weaver, the Engineer was requested to confer with the Chamber of Commerce regarding the East State Street Improvement.

The City Auditor stated that the County Auditor was requesting the budget to be forwarded to him and as the time was late that he believed that he would send the budget to the County Auditor tomorrow and Council could approve it later owing to the required number not being present at this meeting to pass same.

The City Engineer, H. E. Anderson, presented to Council blue prints of statistical charts showing the paving yardage of Alliance since 1890 and other years and a third map of Alliance indicating the improved streets, graphifying the paved streets since that and also material used. The figures showed that while there are seventy-four (74) miles of dedicated streets in Alliance, only thirty-two (32) miles are paved with one mile of alley improvements. There are 51.7 miles of sanitary sewers in the City.
