Communication from Red Cross

My Dear Mr. Barnard: -

At a recent meeting of the Alliance Chapter of the Red Cross, a committee was appointed to study the matter of the unemployment in our city and report some plan of relief for the destitute. This committee, consisting of Miss Mabel Hartzell, N. C. Fetters, and the undersigned, decided to call a conference to study the whole problem.

We are facing unusual conditions in the industrial world. There is much need of relief. This will increase as the winter approaches. We are therefore asking you as Chairman of City Council to be present yourself, or appoint someone to represent you and your organization, at a conference to be held in the Council Chamber Wednesday evening, October 5, at 7:30 o'clock.

We urge that you or your representative be present.

Mayor addresses Council

The Mayor addressed Council calling attention to the murder committed a week ago and asked Council to consider a plan whereby at least two additional patrolmen be added to the present force. The matter was referred to the Finance Committee of Council.

The Mayor also called attention to the expiration on November 1st of the contract under which the city is supplied with gas which expires November 1st.

Regarding smoke nuisance of Supreme Dairy Company.

The residents residing in the neighborhood of the Supreme Dairy Company's Plant were present to urge Council to pass a smoke ordinance for the abandonment of the nuisance. The City Solicitor was instructed to prepare an ordinance to regulate the smoke from trains, manufacturing plants and other consuming industries.

Property owners on W. Washington protest against paving

A committee representing a majority of the property owners on West Washington Street between Union Avenue and Lincoln Avenue protested against the manner in which the concrete was being laid and other matters. On motion of Ryan seconded by H. T. Miller the President was empowered to appoint a committee to investigate the improvement of West Washington Street which motion was agreed to. Thereupon the President appointed Messrs. Ryan, Lower and H. T. Miller.
