

MONDAY EVENING, DECEMBER 19th, 1921.

Council met in regular session with President Barnard in the chair.

The roll being called the following members answered to their names: Messrs. McCredie, Hall, Lower, H. T. Miller, Ryan, and Weaver. Present 6, absent 1.

On motion of Lower seconded by Weaver, the reading of the minutes was dispensed with.

Mayor elect, Clark's bond approved.

Mayor elect, Norman W. Clark's bond was submitted for approval of council in the sum of \$2500.00. Weaver moved seconded by Lower that the bond be approved which motion was agreed to.

The President announced that Mr. McCredie would serve on the same committees that Mr. Cary had served on.

City Auditor calls attention to requirements of Squire, Saunders & Dempsey regarding certain bonds.

City Auditor, Silver called attention of council to the requirements of Messrs. Squire, Saunders & Dempsey, Cleveland, Ohio, regarding \$66,325.00 Alliance, Ohio, 6% improvement bonds. They required that a certificate be made to the effect that the assessments for the improvement of West State Street and South Union Avenue when taken in connection with all other assessments levied within the past five years, do not exceed thirty-three and one-third (33 1/3%) per cent of the value of the property after the completion of the improvement. The matter was referred to the streets and alleys committee and City Engineer.

Report of assessment committee

Weaver, Chairman of the committee on assessments to whom was referred the complaint of C. L. Alden's lot on Harrison reported that they had fixed the value of said lot at \$1500.00 and the Coleman lot on Union Avenue at \$1100.00. The report of the assessment committee was agreed to. Weaver moved seconded by Lower that the City Solicitor be instructed to take the necessary action to have said assessments reduced in Court in accordance with the report of the committee.

On motion of Weaver seconded by Lower, J. H. Miller was excused for non-attendance of this meeting on account of sickness.
