The City Solicitor reported that he in company with the City Engineer, Homer Anderson, visited Pittsburgh and conferred with the smoke inspector of the city of Pittsburgh and had a conference with Prof. H. B. Meller of the Engineering Department of the University of Pittsburgh, who stated that he was willing to come to Alliance to make a survey of the local conditions and make recommendations.

J. H. Miller moved seconded by Hall that the City Solicitor be instructed to prepare a smoke abatement nuisance ordinance.

Engineer submits report on contracts for year 1921

City Engineer, Homer Anderson submitted his report on contracts awarded by the city during the year 1921. The total amount of \$267,681.20 was represented by these contracts. They have all been completed with the exception of sanitary sewers 180 & 181. Completed contracts reach the total of \$263,877.70.

Order regarding fire preventative measure for nurses' home.

Director of Public Safety, Benson read an order received from the State Building and Inspection Department requiring that the boiler room in the nurses' home of the Alliance city hospital be inclosed with a twelve (12') inch wall and standard fire doors, also that the ceiling be fire-proof and other fire preventative measures be taken without delay.

The minutes of this meeting were read and approved.
