An ordinance to license and regulate the taxi-cab business and the taxi-cab drivers was read the first time and referred to the committee of the whole. Mr. Ryan was selected as chairman.

Ordinance No. 30-E

Introduction of Ordinance No. 30-E

An ordinance requiring the registration and licensing of dogs within the city of Alliance was read the first time. Ryan moved seconded by H. D. Miller that the ordinance be referred to a committee of three to be appointed by the President which motion was agreed to. Thereupon the President appointed Messrs. Ryan, Miller and Davis.

On motion of Davis seconded by Riggs, council referred back to the fourth order of business, reports of standing committees.

The Finance committee submitted Ordinance 29-E and recommended its passage.
