An ordinance to provide certain regulations in reference to the operation of coffee houses and confectionery stores in the City of Alliance, Ohio, was read the first time and referred to the Judiciary committee.

An ordinance to regulate the price which the Ohio Public Service company may charge for natural gas for and during the ensuing years was read the first time and referred to the committee of the whole. Mr. Ryan was selected as chairman.

An ordinance providing certain rules and regulations relating to the operation of busses within the City of Alliance, Ohio, having a seating capacity of more than seven (7) persons including the operator was read the first time and referred to the committee on streets and alleys, for immediate action.
