APPLICATION FOR SWITCH TRACK ACROSS THE WEST HALF OF MAHONING AVENUE.

TO THE HONORABLE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLIANCE, OHIO:

Gentlemen:

The undersigned, for himself, his successors and assigns, hereby makes application to your Honorable Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio, for the right, privilege and permission to construct and maintain a certain switch track across a public highway known as Mahoning Avenue, in the City of Alliance, Stark County, Ohio, said point of crossing for said switch track to be at or near the intersection of Mahoning Avenue with Railroad street, so called.

The right and permission hereby applied for is to construct a standard gage switch track at the grade of the present street or highway. This applicant is to plank the space between the rails and one foot outside thereof for the full width of the highway and to keep the street in good repair and safe at all times for traffic and five feet on each side of the rails of said switch track.

Said applicant, his successors and assigns, shall at all times preserve and save the City of Alliance, Ohio, harmless from any and all claims or damages which may arise and grow out of the construction and maintenance of said traffic in the manner and at the point aforesaid.
