

Ordinance No. 2155.

Mr. Miller:

An ordinance regulating operation of motorcycles and motor vehicles upon the streets, alleys, avenues and public places in the City of Alliance, Ohio.

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Alliance, State of Ohio:

Section 1.

That from and after the passage of this ordinance, it shall not be lawful for any person or persons to run, operate, drive or cause to be run, operated or driven, on, over or upon the streets or highways of the City of Alliance, any motorcycle or motor vehicle the motor power of which shall be gasoline, except under the following restrictions:

Section 2.

No motorcycle or motor vehicle shall be operated on, over or across any street, avenue, alley or other public place in the City of Alliance, Ohio, unless the same be equipped with an efficient muffler, and unless an efficient muffler shall be kept in constant use while the machine is being operated or driven.

Section 3.

No motorcycle or motor vehicle while being run, on, over or across any street, avenue, alley or other public place in the City of Alliance, Ohio, shall have in operation any cut-off or other device whereby the muffler of said motorcycle is hindered, impaired or prevented from properly muffling the explosions caused by the operation of said motorcycle or motor vehicle nor shall said motorcycle or motor vehicle be so operated or driven as to cause unnecessary noise.

Section 4.

Any person, or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall, upon conviction thereof be fined not more than \$25.00.

Section 5.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 6.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Ordinance No. 2156.

Mr. Miller:

An ordinance to amend Ordinance Number 1618, passed July 21st, 1913.

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Alliance, State of Ohio:

Section 1.

That Section 2 of Ordinance 1618, passed July 21st, 1913, be amended to read as follows:

"Section 2. No person shall operate an automobile, motorcycle, or any other motor vehicle on any street or public highway in the business and closely built up portions of the City of Alliance, Ohio, at a greater rate of speed than eight (8) miles an hour, or any street or public highway elsewhere in the corporation at a greater rate of speed than fifteen (15) miles an hour."

Section 2.

That Section 3 of Ordinance 1618, passed July 21st, 1913, be amended to read as follows:

"Section 3. The business and closely built up portion of the City of Alliance, Ohio, wherein the eight mile speed limit for automobiles, motorcycles, or other motor vehicles shall be applied as follows: Main Street from Pennsylvania Depot to Union Avenue; Union Avenue from College Street to Mill Street; State Street from Cherry Avenue to D. E. C. & W. R. R.; Arch Avenue from Main Street to Broadway Street; Freedom Avenue from Main Street to Cambridge; Union Avenue from Broadway Street to Cly Street; South Liberty Avenue from Main Street to Broadway Street; South Seneca Street from Main Street to Broadway Street; East Patterson Street from Franklin Street to Freedom Street; South Webb Avenue from Ash Street to Broadway; North Arch Street from Main Street to Hester Street."

Section 3.

That Section 6 of Ordinance 1618, passed July 21st, 1913, be amended to read as follows:

"Section 6. No motorcycle or bicycle operated on or over any street in the City of Alliance, shall carry two persons unless the extra person is carried on a tandem seat, which tandem seat shall be attached back of the person operating said motorcycle or bicycle."

Section 4.

That Section 7 of Ordinance 1618, passed July 21st, 1913, be amended to read as follows:

"Section 7. Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined not more than \$25.00 for the first offense and for the second and each subsequent offense, such person shall be fined upon conviction not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$50.00."

Section 5. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 6. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

An ordinance to amend Ordinance Number 1211 passed August 11th, 1911.

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Alliance, State of Ohio:

Section 1.

That Section 10 of Ordinance Number 1211 passed August 11th, 1911, be amended to read as follows:

"Section 10. Vehicles crossing from one side of a thoroughfare to the other side of a thoroughfare, shall do so by turning to the left so as to head in the same direction as the traffic on that side of the thoroughfare towards which the crossing is made. No crossing shall be made on Main Street between the Cleveland & Pittsburgh Railroad and Union Avenue except at the intersection of a thoroughfare."

Section 2.

That Section 19 of Ordinance Number 1211 passed August 11th, 1911, be amended to read as follows:

"Section 19. The driver of any vehicle or street car shall stop upon the signal of a police officer."

Section 3.

That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLIANCE, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1.

That the plans and specifications now on file in the Department of Public Service for the construction of a storm sewer running from a point in Mill Street about 125 feet east of the east line of South Linden Avenue to a point north-eastwardly of said starting point a distance of 270 feet, be and the same are hereby approved.

Section 2.

That the Director of Public Service be and hereby is authorized to enter into a contract for the construction of said storm sewer, in accordance with the plans and specifications now on file in the Department of Public Service, with the lowest and best bidder after advertisement according to law and not to exceed in total the sum of One Thousand One Hundred and Forty-five Dollars, (\$1145.00).

Section 3.

That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and that its enactment is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare.

Section 4.

That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

An ordinance to authorize the Director of Public Service to make an additional expenditure of \$2600.00 and to purchase a certain tract of land in Knox Township, Columbiana County, Ohio, from John J. Smith and Rosa Smith, necessary in the construction of the Westville Storage Reservoir, for enlarging and improving the water works system of the City of Alliance, Ohio.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLIANCE, STATE OF OHIO, THREE-FOURTHS OF ALL MEMBERS ELECTED THERETO CONCURRING:

Section 1.

That the Director of Public Service be and hereby is authorized and directed to make an additional expenditure of not to exceed \$2600.00 in the construction of the Westville Storage Reservoir for enlarging and improving the water works system of the City of Alliance, Ohio, and that said Director of Public Service be and hereby is authorized and directed to purchase with said \$2600.00 in the name and for the use of the City of Alliance, Ohio, from John J. Smith and Rosa Smith, the following described premises, deemed necessary in the construction of the Westville Storage Reservoir, for the enlarging and improving the water works system of the City of Alliance, Ohio, to-wit: Being a part of the northwest quarter of Section 1, Knox Township, Columbiana County, Ohio, and beginning at an iron pin on the center of Section 1; thence east along the center line of said section 604.6 feet to a point, being the east line of Case lands, now the City of Alliance, Ohio; thence north along said east line of the City of Alliance, Ohio, land 550.8 feet to the true place of beginning, said point being 534.2 feet south of the south line of Imoberstag land, now the City of Alliance, Ohio; thence east 4 degrees 33 minutes north 730.7 feet; thence north 2 degrees 25 minutes east 476.2 feet to the south line of Imoberstag land; thence west 0 degrees 0 minutes 742.6 feet along Imoberstag's south line; thence south 0 degrees 37 minutes west 534.2 feet along the east line of Case land, now the City of Alliance, Ohio, to the place of beginning, said tract containing 8.53 acres of land, more or less.

Section 2.

That upon the said John J. Smith and Rosa Smith executing and delivering to the City of Alliance, Ohio, its successors and assigns, a warranty deed to said premises, free and clear from all encumbrances, subject to the approval of the City Solicitor, the said Director of Public Service is hereby authorized to approve a voucher and the City Auditor is hereby authorized to draw a warrant on the City Treasury for the payment to John J. Smith and Rosa Smith of the sum of \$2600.00 in full payment of the above described premises.

Section 3.

That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and its enactment is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare. The necessity therefore lies in the fact that the water supply of the City of Alliance, Ohio, and its citizens is at certain seasons of the year insufficient and that the completion of the said Westville Storage Reservoir and the purchase of the necessary land therefore is urgent and necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the City of Alliance, Ohio, and its citizens.

That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALLIANCE, STATE OF OHIO, TWO-THIRDS OF THE MEMBERS ELECTED THERETO CONCURRING:

Section 1.

That it is deemed necessary by the Council of the City of Alliance, Ohio, to issue and sell the bonds of said city in the sum of \$15,350.00, for the purpose of paying the city's Portion of improving the following streets: E. Patterson Street between Arch Avenue and Freedom Avenue; Alley west of Arch Avenue between Main Street and Prospect Street; Hester Avenue between Mechanic Avenue and Patterson Street; Arch Avenue between Main Street and Hester Avenue; Fifth Street between Hester Avenue and Freedom Avenue; Fourth Street between Hester Avenue and Freedom Avenue; Alley west of Linden Avenue between Main Street and Prospect Street; Linden Avenue between Main Street and Prospect Street; Prospect Street between Mechanic Avenue and Freedom Avenue; Alley north of Main Street between Linden Avenue and Mechanic Avenue; Avalon Avenue between South Street and Eleventh Street; E. State Street between Liberty Avenue and Mahoning Avenue; N. Union Avenue between Ely and Wayne; Rush and Noble.

Section 2.

That the bonds of said city be issued in the sum of \$15,350.00 for the aforesaid purpose, each of said bonds to be in the denomination of 30 for \$500.00, 1 for \$350.00, and numbered consecutively from 1 to 28 and all made payable on the 1st day of April 1936, and bearing interest at the rate of 5% per annum, payable semi-annually evidenced on coupons attached thereto. Said bonds shall be dated April 1st, 1916, and shall run for a period of 20 years from said date and said bonds shall be payable at the office of the Sinking Fund Trustees of Alliance, Ohio.

Section 3.

Said bonds shall express upon their face the purpose for which they are issued and that they are issued in pursuance of this ordinance. They shall be prepared, issued and delivered at the direction of the Finance Committee of the City Council and the City Auditor, and sealed with the Corporate Seal of said City, and the interest coupons attached to said bonds shall be executed by the City Auditor with his signature printed or lithographed thereon.

Section 4.

Said bonds shall be first offered at par and accrued interest to the Trustees of the Sinking Fund, in their official capacity and if the Sinking Fund Trustees refuse to take any or all of said bonds at par and interest, then said bonds not so taken shall be offered at par and accrued interest to the Board of Commissioners of the Sinking Fund of the City School District and if the Board of Commissioners of the Sinking Fund of the City School District refuse to take any or all of said bonds at par and interest, then said bonds not so taken shall be offered in writing at par and accrued interest to the Industrial Commission of the State of Ohio, and such of said bonds as are not taken, shall be advertised for public sale and sold in the manner provided by law, but not for less than their par value and accrued interest.

Section 5.

That the proceeds from the sale of said bonds except the premiums and accrued interest thereon shall be placed in the City Treasury to the credit of; \$2008.13 E. Patterson Street between Arch Avenue and Freedom Avenue; \$64.50 Alley west of Arch Avenue between Main Street and Prospect Street; \$3673.82 Hester Avenue between Mechanic Avenue and Patterson Street; \$2269.52 Arch Avenue between Main Street and Hester Avenue; \$669.61 Fifth Street between Hester Avenue and Freedom Avenue; \$544.79 Fourth Street between Hester Avenue and Freedom Avenue; \$64.50 Alley west of Linden Avenue between Main Street and Prospect Street; \$1250.00 Linden Avenue between Main Street and Prospect Street; \$2120.00 Prospect Street between Mechanic Avenue and Freedom Avenue; \$373.00 Alley north of Main Street between Linden Avenue and Mechanic Avenue; \$587.13 Avalon Avenue between South Street and Eleventh Street; \$576.07 Rush and Noble; \$489.60 E. State between Liberty and Mahoning; \$576.07 N. Union From Ely to Wayne; and shall be disbursed upon proper vouchers for the purpose of paying the City's Portion of the improvements as aforesaid, and for no other purpose. And the premiums and accrued interest received from such sale shall be transferred to the Trustees of the Sinking Fund to be applied by them in the manner provided by law.

Section 6.

That for the purpose of paying the interest upon said bonds, there shall be levied and assessed upon all taxable property in the City of Alliance, Ohio, an annual tax sufficient to raise the sum of \$767.50 or so much thereof as may be raised for said purpose. Party of the second part further promises and agrees to render all assistance necessary including personal attendance and assistance of Mr. F. W. Ballard at all trials and hearings held before the Public Utilities Commission concerning said rate ordinance and concerning the establishment and fixing of a rate for light and power by the Public Utilities Commission, for the sum of \$700.00.

Said party of the second part further agrees to furnish all necessary engineers, clerks, etc., in making the appraisalment of said property and to pay their own expenses in connection with the appraisalment, preparations and trial.

IN CONSIDERATION WHEREOF, said party of the first part hereby promises and agrees to pay said party of the second part for the appraisalment of said property, the sum of \$1200.00 upon the completion of said appraisalment and the sum of \$600.00 for preparation for trial when all preparations, exhibits, tabulations, etc., have been made for trial of said matter before the Public Utilities Commission and party of the first part further agrees to pay the amount of \$700.00 for assistance at trial to party of the second part at the time of the final termination of the proceedings before the Public Utilities Commission.

It is mutually understood and agreed that in the event that the City of Alliance and the Alliance Gas & Power Company should arrive at a settlement in regard to the rate to be charged for light and power before the said appraisalment is completed, party of the second part shall be paid proportionately to the amount of work which they have completed on said appraisalment and that in the event said settlement should be arrived at after the appraisalment is made and after some preparation has been made for the trial, then said party of the second part shall be paid for appraisalment in full and proportionate payment shall be made for further work done in preparing for the trial.

It is further mutually agreed that in the event that trial is actually started and hearing held before the Commission, then said party of the second part shall be paid in full for the trial of said cause.

Section 4. Any person, or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall, upon conviction thereof be fined not more than \$25.00.

WHEREAS, such persons are put to work filling ditches for the Water Department as well as doing work on the streets and alleys of the City of Alliance, and

WHEREAS, the price of fuel for the Water Works Pumping Station has been increased from thirteen cents (13¢) per thousand cubic feet, to thirty cents (30¢) per thousand cubic feet, and that the supply is liable to be discontinued without notice, it becomes necessary to increase this appropriation, and

WHEREAS, the appropriation for the maintenance of Structures and Improvement for Viaducts is not sufficient to carry on the work as contemplated by the Department of Public Service, it becomes necessary to increase this appropriation; therefore,

Mr. Binkley: An Ordinance authorizing the Director of Public Service to enter into a contract for enlarging and improving the sewage disposal plant.

SECTION 1. That the plans and specifications now on file in the Department of Public Service of the City of Alliance, Ohio, for enlarging and improving the sewage disposal plant be and the same are hereby approved.
