The present Court Bailiff, Frank P. Taylor, of the Municipal Court of the City of Alliance, Ohio, is contemplating resigning from his office unless his salary be raised from \$100 to \$125.00 per month. In the performance of his duty he uses his automobile. By using his automobile he can do a great deal more work than he could on foot. He has to pay the upkeep of his machine in serving papers and performing the duties of Court Bailiff of said Court.

The Municipal Court of the City of Alliance, Ohio, is quite a valuable asset to the City and has been more than a profitable proposition for the City.

Mr. Frank P. Taylor is well qualified for the work of Court Bailiff and has performed his duties promptly and well and we think should be retained if possible.

We, the undersigned, therefore petition your Honorable Body to increase the salary of the Municipal Court Bailiff from \$100.00 per month to \$125.00 per month, so that after paying the upkeep of his automobile he will have about \$100.00 left for himself. We suggest that the City Solicitor prepare an ordinance raising his salary to said sum in order that Mr. Taylor will continue as Court Bailiff.
