Ordinance No. 80-E

An ordinance creating the office of Assistant Instructor for student nurses at the Alliance City Hospital and fixing the salary of same was read the second time. Ryan moved seconded by McCredie that the statutory rules requiring ordinances and resolutions to be read on three different days be suspended and Ordinance No. 80-E be read the third time. The question being on the suspension of the rules, the yeas and nays were taken and resulted yeas 7, nays 0. Those who voted in the affirmative were Messrs. Akins, Davis, McCredie, Miller, Riggs, Ryan, and Trott. So the rules were suspended and the ordinance read the third time. The question being on the passage of the ordinance, the yeas and nays were taken and resulted yeas 4, nays 3. Those who voted in the affirmative were Messrs. Akins, Davis, Riggs, and Trott. Those who voted in the negative were Messrs. McCredie, Miller, and Ryan. So the ordinance having received the necessary majority vote, was passed.

Mr. Trott introduced the following resolution:

Resolution

WHEREAS, this Council contemplated issuing of \$34,000.00 bonds which sum of \$2,000.00 is proposed to be used for the erecting of a building for the City Hospital; \$2,050.00 for furniture and furnishings for the City Hospital; \$10,200.00 for equipment for the City Hospital; \$19,250.00 for apparatus; \$500.00 is proposed to be used for storm water drainage, all of which construction, furniture and furnishings, equipment and apparatus will be in accordance with the general specifications heretofore adopted by the Board of Hospital Commissioners of the City of Alliance, and  
WHEREAS, Section 2295-7 and Section 2295-10 of the General Code require the fiscal officer of the City to certify to this council his estimate of the life of the property, asset or improvement proposed to be acquired or constructed from the proceeds of said bonds and also to certify to this council the maximum maturity of such bonds, calculated in accordance with the provisions of Section 2295-9, and  
WHEREAS, the City Auditor is the fiscal officer of this city as defined by Section 2295-6 of the General Code,  
NOW THEREFORE, the Auditor of this city is hereby requested to certify to this council his conclusions as to the estimated life of such improvement and the maximum maturity of such bonds.

Davis moved seconded by Ryan that it be referred to council as a whole. Mr. Davis was selected as chairman.

Council recessed ten minutes.

Question of approaching contest regard to higher rate for telephone referred to committee of whole, Solicitor and Mayor.

A representative of an accounting firm of Columbus appeared before council in regard to being retained by the city in the approaching contest before the Ohio Utilities Commission where the Ohio Bell Telephone Company is seeking a higher rate for unifying service in cities where the Ohio State and Bell systems are being merged. The matter was referred to Council as a whole, City Solicitor and Mayor. Mr. Ryan was selected as chairman.
