

MONDAY EVENING, APRIL 16th, 1923

Council met in regular session with President Barnard in the chair.

The roll being called, the following members answered to their names: Messrs. Akins, Davis, Miller, Riggs, Ryan, and Trott. Present 6, absent 1.

On motion of Ryan seconded by Davis, the reading of the minutes was dispensed with.

The Director of Public Service, Mr. Walter W. Scott, called attention to the needed improvements and repairs at the Sewage Disposal Plant. He estimated the cost at approximately sixty thousand (\$60,000) dollars. The matter was referred to the Sewer Committee for action.

It was suggested that the question of issuing the bonds for the improvement of the Sewage Disposal Plant, be submitted at the August Primaries.

REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES.

Mr. Davis:

An ordinance providing for the issuance of bonds of the City of Alliance in the sum of fifty thousand (\$50,000) dollars for the purpose of purchasing and condemning the necessary lands for one or more parks or public playgrounds south of Main Street, Alliance and one or more parks or public playgrounds north of Main Street and for improving, equipping and furnishing the said lands and any other land now owned by the City of Alliance, for park or playground purposes in an amount greater than one per cent, was read the second time. Davis moved seconded by Ryan that the statutory rules requiring ordinances and resolutions to be read on three different days be suspended and Ordinance No. 19-F be read the third time. The question being on the suspension of the rules, the yeas and nays were taken and resulted yeas 5, nays 1. Those who voted in the affirmative were Messrs. Akins, Davis, Miller, Ryan and Trott. Mr. Riggs voted in the negative. So the motion not having received the necessary three-fourths majority vote was lost.
