SECOND READING OF ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS.

Resolution No. 29-F

Mr. Ryan:

Declaring it necessary to improve East Main Street from Union Avenue east to the right of way of the Pennsylvania Railroad Company, Arch Avenue from Market St. to Prospect St., Linden Avenue from Market St. to Prospect St., Freedom Avenue from Market St. to Prospect St., Seneca Avenue from Market Street to Warehouse St., Liberty Avenue from Market St. to Main Street and the north side of Warehouse St. from Seneca Avenue to Freedom Avenue by constructing a white way or boulevard street lighting system was read the second time.

A Resolution declaring it necessary to improve South Arch Avenue from East Main Street to Milner Street by repaving same to the width of forty (40) feet was read the first time and referred to the committee on streets and alleys.

Ordinance No. 37-F

Mr. Ryan:

An ordinance declaring it necessary to widen the paved portion of South Arch Avenue between Main Street and Milner Street in the City of Alliance, Ohio, was read the first time and referred to the committee on streets and alleys.

Resolution No. 34-F

Mr. Ryan:

A Resolution declaring it necessary to issue bonds for the purpose of constructing an overhead bridge at Lincoln Avenue in the City of Alliance, Ohio, was read the first time and referred to the Finance Committee.
