Report of the
Com on R.R. & T.
on Street R.R.
Co.

We herewith submit our report of our investigation of the proposed route for the Ravenna-Alliance Electric Railroad into the City of Alliance O.

First. We approve of the said Electric Railroad entering this city over the Union Avenue to East Main Street and thence east on East Main Street provided the said Electric Railroad will bear the entire expense of

grading North Union Avenue and also pay all damages to property owners by reason of the change of grade on said Union Avenue.

Second. We believe that it would be economical for the Ravenna Alliance Railroad and the A. A. Short line to enter the city over the same streets and alleys and believe further that it would be for the best interest of the city for both the aforesaid Electric Railroads to enter the city the same streets and alleys, and we would therefore recommend that the two Electric Railroads aforesaid meet north of the Penna tracks at some point agreeable to both of the said Railroad and from this given point, enter the city over North Arch Avenue to East Main Street
